
Meet and Greets



San Diego Convention Center




The San Diego Convention Center is steps away from the Gaslamp Quarter of downtown San Diego with the San Diego Bay and Coronado Island in its backyard. There are three levels in the building with all exhibit halls on the ground floor. There are 3 Starbucks locations and water bottle fill stations. An inclusive restroom is located in Lobby A.

In addition to whatever items you would typically pack for a trip, here are some items to consider packing for a visit to TwitchCon in San Diego.

☐ Hand Sanitizer
☐ Face masks
☐ Cosplay if you'll be dressing up
☐ Deodorant - Don't stink. You'll be in close proximity to a lot of people.
*Backpacks are prohibited. Bags must be no larger than 12"W x 12"H x 6"D (30cm W x 30cm H x 6cm D). Search for "stadium bags" on sites like Amazon for clear, size-compliant bags. Attendees are encouraged to use clear bags to expedite entry. (TwitchCon FAQ)

Convention Tips

Whether you've been to a convention like TwitchCon before or this is your first time, here are some tips for attending TwitchCon in San Diego.

- 1. Plan your days. Review the schedule beforehand. Pick a few panels, events, and meetups that are a priority for you. Don't make a strict, tight schedule. Have some flexibility and backups. Account for time spent walking and waiting in long queues. Wait times for popular panels and meet and greets can approach an hour or more. Don't stress yourself out, and remember to take time to eat. Speaking of...
- 2. **Bring some snacks.** You can get so preoccupied you might forget to eat. Have snacks so you don't go hungry, and set aside time in your schedule for at least one proper meal.
- 3. **Stay hydrated.** You'll be walking around a lot in a large convention center. Have water on standby.
- 4. **Manage fatigue.** You will have no problem getting in your 10,000 steps for the day. Your feet will hurt, and your legs will get tired, especially if you are not physically active. The convention center is large, and queues can be long both in length and time particularly for popular events and meet and greets. Wear your most comfortable shoes. Take every opportunity available to sit and rest. Consider taking over-the-counter medication to alleviate pain.
- 5. **Get enough sleep**, or at least as much as possible.
- 6. **Maintain good hygiene.** Shower daily, put on deodorant, wash your hands regularly, and consider bringing hand sanitizer.
- 7. **Be courteous and respectful with cosplayers.** Ask permission before taking photographs, and remember cosplay is *not* consent.
- 8. **Be courteous and respectful with streamers.** Be respectful of the little time they have in their busy schedules, and don't overstep their boundaries. That being said, many streamers attend TwitchCon to meet their fans, so feel free to greet them if they present the opportunity.
- 9. **Take some time to explore the city** outside of the convention center especially if it's your first time in the area. Consider coming in a few days before or leaving a few days after TwitchCon to tour around at your own pace, since convention days are busy.
- 10. **Make a budget and start saving <u>now!</u>** One of the worst things you can do is go into debt after attending a convention. The next section lists several areas to account for in your <u>budget</u>.

Budget

It is incredibly important that your visit to TwitchCon doesn't break the bank. Make a budget and start saving now. Listed below are costs you might consider in building your budget.

Ticket/Badge price	3-day \$249 / 1-day \$159-\$169 / Block Party Pass Add-on +\$125
Airfare to and from SAN	Check a flight aggregator, like <u>Google Flights</u>
Hotel or other accommodation	~\$250 - \$350/night. Consider splitting with a friend/friends to save money.
Rental Car	From around \$70/day
Rideshare	\$7 - \$30 per ride. Highly variable based on distance, traffic, and demand. Check rideshare apps like <u>Lyft</u> and <u>Uber</u> for estimates.
Gasoline	Avg. \$4.55/gal as of late July 2025
Parking	\$10 - \$30 per day, roughly. Around \$65/night for overnight hotel parking.
Transit Fares (MTS)	\$2.50 per one-way journey—\$6 max per day—on buses and trolleys. 2 trolley stops in front of the convention center. <u>Fares and Passes</u>
Food	Around \$25 - \$35 per meal at restaurants
	Some may spend around \$100 - \$200 for the entire weekend. Set a number based on what you can afford and <i>stick to it</i> .
Outside activities and attractions	Anywhere from \$0 - ~\$150. Variable based on type of activity. See $\underline{\text{Nearby}}$ $\underline{\text{Attractions}}$
	Suggested 10% - 15% buffer on top of your initial budget total to cover unforeseen expenses.

Flying into San Diego

Flight Discounts

If you are flying into San Diego, discounts are available through Delta and Southwest.

Visit the <u>TwitchCon website</u> for details.

San Diego International Airport (SAN) is only about a 10-minute drive to Downtown San Diego without traffic. A few hotels may provide shuttles to and from the airport. Friends or family picking you up can wait at the *cell phone lot*. If renting a car, a free shuttle can take you to the rental car center. Follow signage for rideshare, taxi, and shuttle company pickups. <u>Public transit</u> is also available.

Construction is underway at Terminal 1, so plan ahead and give yourself extra time, especially if flying in or out of Terminal 1.

Rental Car Center



A car is recommended if you want to freely explore the sprawl beyond downtown San Diego. Beware that hotels and other locations downtown charge a significant fee to park your car.

The Rental Car Center at San Diego International Airport is located at 3355 Admiral Boland Way, San Diego, CA 92101. Free shuttles continually ferry travelers between the terminals and the rental car center. The companies below operate at the rental car center:

Driving to Downtown San Diego

From LA/OC

Take the 5 directly to downtown San Diego. When you see the infamous "boobs" of the decommissioned San Onofre Nuclear Power Plant, you're about halfway there.



From the Inland Empire

Take the 15 to the 163 to downtown San Diego. Once you start seeing the beautiful trees of Balboa park on both sides, you're almost there!



Parking

1) Convention Center Parking

A 1,950-vehicle garage is located underneath the convention center with entrances on *Harbor Drive*. Daily parking rates are around \$15-20. No In/Out privileges.


2 Hilton San Diego Bayfront Parking

Hotels Near The Convention Center

Hotels are available at a special rate through TwitchCon's hotel partner Connections Housing:

TwitchCon San Diego 2025 - Start your reservation

Hotels' discounted rates range from around \$249/night to \$349/night + taxes and fees. Check back regularly as availability changes.

To avoid a penalty charge equivalent to one night's room rate and applicable taxes per reservation, cancellations must be received at least 72 hours before your scheduled arrival.

Parking at downtown hotels

If you plan on renting or bringing a car to San Diego, beware that overnight parking at hotels in the heart of downtown can be exorbitantly expensive. Hotel parking normally costs at least \$55/night and is commonly valet-only, though in & out privileges are typically available.

Airbnb

There are some Airbnb's available in the nearby *Gaslamp quarter*. [Sample Airbnb search] Also consider places near the Green Line, or neighborhoods a short drive away via rideshare or rental car.

Other Hotels

Some hotels are within a few minutes' walk from various Trolley stations, and they may be a good option if hotels downtown are outside of your budget. There is direct access to the convention center via the Green Line. Otherwise, use your favorite hotel booking site to find a hotel within your budget.

Hotel Circle

There are also several hotels available that may better fit your budget in the nearby *Hotel Circle* area in the *Mission Valley*. The Hotel Circle area is a 10-20 minute drive to the *convention center*, by taking the 8 west towards 5 south or east towards 163 south.

There is inconvenient access to public transit in this area, so consider renting a car or using rideshare.



Transportation

San Diego MTS (Metropolitan Transit System)

Public transportation for the greater San Diego area is provided by MTS (Metropolitan Transit System). They operate a network of buses and trolleys that connect San Diego. San Diego's public transit system could serve your transportation needs if you don't need to travel far outside the downtown area.



San Diego Trolley

The San Diego trolleys are a rail network operated by MTS that connect communities of the greater San Diego area with downtown. The trolleys consist of 3 main lines that generally operate at a frequency of every 15 minutes. There is no service roughly after midnight until about 4-5am.



Green Line

The Green Line heads north from *Downtown San Diego*, passes east through *Mission Valley* and ends in *El Cajon*.

Convention Center Station and Gaslamp Quarter Station are right across the street from the convention center in downtown SD.

Blue Line

The Blue Line, aka the UC San Diego Blue Line, runs between La Jolla/UC San Diego from the north, through Downtown San Diego, and ends south in San Ysidro next to the Border of Mexico at Tijuana.

Transfer to the Green Line from the north between *Old Town* and *Sante Fe Depot* stations, or walk to the *Convention Center* from *12th and Imperial Station* if coming from the south.

Orange Line

The Orange Line runs between Downtown San Diego and El Cajon via Lemon Grove.

The Convention Center is about a 15 minute walk from 12th and Imperial Station.

Copper Line

The Copper Line is a connector Trolley that serves stations between *Santee* and the *El Cajon Transit Center*—where the Green and Orange Line terminate.

Trolley Parking

Limited parking may be available along trolley line stations, sometimes for free. Visit the MTS website for a list of stations and lot sizes. [Transit Station Parking]

Fares and Passes

\$2.50	One-way journey on trolley or bus. Includes unlimited transfers for 2 hours
\$6.00	Adult 1-day pass on <u>PRONTO card</u> or app only. Earned after spending a maximum of \$6 in fares in one day.

PRONTO card

Pay-As-You-Go by tapping a PRONTO card or scanning the PRONTO app at a validator on station platforms or buses. You will always earn the best fare. Pay a one-way fare on the first tap, which includes 2 hours of unlimited transfers thereon. Subsequent taps initiate a new fare and 2 hour period until the day pass is earned (\$6 daily max), which allows unlimited trips for the rest of the day.

PRONTO cards can be purchased for \$2 at retail outlets, Trolley ticket machines, or the transit store at 12th and Imperial Transit Center, near the convention center. You can also download the PRONTO app for free and use your phone as a virtual card. Scan the app at the validator on every ride.

Load money onto your card using the PRONTO app, online at <u>ridepronto.com</u>, at ticket machines, or through other methods listed on <u>ridepronto.com</u>.

Contactless payment

If you don't want to use a PRONTO card or PRONTO app, you can instead use contactless payment methods to pay your fare, such as contactless debit and credit cards, smartphones, and wearable smart watches.

Use a contactless payment method just like a PRONTO card by tapping your payment method at a fare validator on a bus or trolley platform. Just like the PRONTO card, your fare includes 2 hours of free transfers from the first tap. **NOTE**: Fare capping is <u>NOT</u> available at this time. If you want to take advantage of best fare (fare cap) pricing, use a PRONTO card or PRONTO app.

Transit at SAN Airport

Bus Route 992 stops in front of each terminal, with service every 15 minutes during peak hours. It's a 15 minute ride to *Santa Fe Depot* in *Downtown San Diego*, where you can transfer to all major transit options, including all MTS buses and trolley lines.

Ticket machines are available near Information Centers, or pay fares with the PRONTO app.

The San Diego Flyer airport shuttle - operated independently by the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority - operates every 20-30 minutes and takes you to *Old Town Transit Center* for free. From there, you can transfer to MTS trolleys and bus lines.

Vintage Trolley

The Silver Line uses restored vintage streetcars which run a loop around *Downtown SD*. Vintage Trolleys depart *12th and Imperial* every 30 minutes 9:07am - 5:07pm.

Schedules/Route Planning

Use apps like **Google Maps** or <u>Citymapper</u> which incorporate real-time transit data to provide the fastest routes to your destination.

Rideshares

Rideshare services are widely available throughout San Diego. Consider using rideshare services if any of the following apply:

- Rental car and parking costs are outside of your budget.
- Public transit options are infrequent and inconvenient from where you are staying or going, especially outside of *Downtown San Diego*.
- You plan on drinking late into the night after transit services have stopped.

Both Uber and Lyft operate in San Diego. Trip fares vary based on distance, traffic, and demand, but a typical trip from the airport to downtown costs around \$20. Beware of surge pricing during times of high-demand, which can force you to cough up \$50 - \$100 for a ride in the worst cases.

Food, Dining, and Bars

San Diego is an amazing food city with a mix of flavors, influenced by its proximity to the ocean and nearby Mexico. There's a vibrant craft beer culture with notable breweries like Ballast Point, Stone Brewing Co., and Straus Brewing. The nearby *Gaslamp Quarter* hosts a variety of bars and restaurants within a short walk from the convention center. The following are a few places in the greater San Diego area that I recommend from my years in San Diego.

Tacos El Gordo







San Diego is home to some of the best and most authentic Mexican food there is, and *Tacos El Gordo* is no exception, serving up delicious authentic Tijuana-style tacos. Grab a tray line up in front of the counter for the kind of meat you want. Do you want asada or adobada? Would you want that in a taco, or other variations like the mula, vampiro, or quesadilla? Try ordering the San Diego favorite Carne Asada Fries. Feeling more adventurous? Try cabeza (beef head), tripa (tripe), or lengua (beef tongue). All tacos are made to order in front of you at the counter. Collect as many foods from each counter as you want, then pay at the cashier.

Phil's BBQ







Phil's BBQ is another San Diego institution with multiple locations throughout the greater San Diego area. Get some baby back ribs, beef ribs, or bbq chicken, (though you won't find brisket here). While it probably doesn't hold a light to the coveted BBQ regions of the American south, it's still very good in its own right.

The nearest location from downtown is in *Point Loma* on *Sports Arena Blvd* • *Phil's BBQ*. If you're flying out of San Diego airport, you can eat at their location in *Terminal 2* • *Phil's BBQ*.

Convoy District








If you're in the mood for Asian food, head to the *Convoy District*. *Convoy Street* - the district's namesake - is lined with a wide variety of Asian restaurants and businesses. You can find pretty much any kind of Asian cuisine you want: ramen at • *Tajima Ramen Convoy*, Korean soft tofu soup at • *Tofu House*, all-you-can-eat Korean BBQ at • *Manna BBQ*, conveyor belt sushi at • *Kura Revolving Sushi Bar*, Dim Sum at • *Jasmine Seafood Restaurant & Express*, and MANY more.

Convoy is in the Kearny Mesa neighborhood and can be reached by taking the 163 north from downtown SD.

The Shout! House







The Shout! House is Downtown San Diego's premier dueling piano bar and music venue located in the nearby Gaslamp Quarter. Grab some drinks then laugh, dance, and sing your heart out as two piano players on stage play and sing the audience's requests. Reservations are recommended as they get fully booked on weekends.

• The Shout! House is on Fourth Ave between G St and Market St, about a 15-minute walk from the convention center.

Nearby Attractions

• Petco Park







Petco Park is the home of the San Diego Padres, located next to the convention center and Gaslamp Quarter. This baseball park was the venue of the TwitchCon party in 2022, where Megan Thee Stallion, Kim Petras, and Meet Me @ The Altar performed.

♥ Balboa Park







Gardens, beautiful architecture, arts, museums, and attractions abound at *Balboa Park*. The park is public and free to enter. All museums, performance venues, and other institutions are independently run and have their own admission policies and ticket prices. Check with each institution for pricing. A free tram makes regular stops by major parking lots and attractions for your convenience.

Balboa Park is just a short drive from downtown, and parking is free. You can also reach Balboa Park by MTS bus via Rapid 215 from downtown.

♥ San Diego Zoo







Within the vast limits of *Balboa Park*, you will find the world-renown *San Diego Zoo*. At one of America's most visited zoos, you can learn about and see wildlife on their guided bus tours, ride the aerial tram, attend talks by wildlife care specialists, watch a movie at the 4D theater, or tour the animal exhibits at your own pace. Adult tickets start at \$70.

The zoo is just a short 10 minute drive from downtown, and parking is free in front of the zoo. The zoo is also accessible via MTS bus by taking Rapid 215.

♥ Coronado Island







Coronado is a small "island" next to downtown SD, with various restaurants, parks, beaches, shopping, and hotels. Drive into Coronado from downtown by crossing the nearby peculiarly curved Coronado Bridge, or take a 15 minute ferry ride from the Convention Center. Ferries depart every half hour until 9:55pm or 10:55pm on Fri/Sat. Ferry tickets are \$9 each way and are recommended to be purchased online ahead of time.

♥ SeaWorld San Diego









SeaWorld is a marine animal theme park home to a plethora of marine wildlife. Visit animal exhibits, watch their shows, or enjoy their rides. Tickets start at \$73.99 for dates around TwitchCon weekend.

SeaWorld is a 10-15 minute drive from downtown. Go on 5 north and take exit 21 for Sea World Dr/Tecolote Rd, turn left onto Sea World Dr, and follow signs for SeaWorld. Transit via MTS Trolley/Bus takes 45 mins. - 1 hour. From downtown, take the Green Line or Blue Line to Old Town Transit Center, then take bus route 9 towards Pacific Beach via SeaWorld.

♥ USS Midway Museum







The USS Midway was the longest-serving aircraft carrier in the 20th century, commissioned right after the end of World War II in 1945, and decommissioned in 1992. Since June of 2004, the USS Midway has called the *Navy Pier* at *San Diego's Embarcadero* its home, now serving as a museum.

The museum is open daily 10am - 5pm, with the last admission at 4pm. Expect to spend around 4 hours there. Online tickets are \$39 for adults, \$26 for veterans with ID. Add an extra +\$2 if tickets are purchased at the door. Parking is available on *Navy Pier* next to the museum and costs around \$10 - \$20. The museum is also a 5 minute walk from *Sante Fe* and *America Plaza* station, with service by the Green Line and Blue Line.

♥ Old Town San Diego







Experience the historic legacy of San Diego at *Old Town*. At the *Old Town San Diego State Historic Park* you can see preserved historic buildings that reflect life of San Diego in the 1800s. There are a variety of restaurants serving a variety of cuisines including some of the best Mexican food, hotels, museums, shops, and some hants sites.

Old Town is a short 7-minute drive from downtown via 5 north without traffic, or take a 10-minute ride on the Green Line or Blue Line to Old Town Station.

♠ La Jolla Cove





If you're looking for a quaint, picturesque beach to take in the sights of the Pacific Ocean, and maybe even see some sea lions, *La Jolla Cove* is the place to visit. *La Jolla Cove* is a small beach tucked between sandstone cliffs. Dig your toes in the sand, take a dip in the water, take pictures of the sea lions, walk in the tide pools

in low tide, or explore the caves. If you're a little more adventurous, *La Jolla Cove* is a popular place for diving and snorkeling. Once you're done with the beach, you can walk up to the nearby Village of La Jolla to grab a bite to eat at one of the many restaurants, or peruse their shops.
