ADVOCACY WEEK SCHEDULE AND ACTIVITIES

By January 27: Afterschool Empowers Youth Success Video Collective. Take these simple steps to add your voice! See Trudy's video for inspiration!

AFTERSCHOOL BUDGET MATERIALS

Please review <u>these materials</u> to learn more about afterschool priorities, funding, and other resources to educate you about the afterschool landscape. Note: This resource document is also shared with decisionmakers for the same purpose.

TALKING POINTS

Please utilize these talking points to provide further context on this year's afterschool priorities and coordinate messaging about the importance of afterschool.

SAMPLE MEETING SCRIPT Sample Script for Meetings with Legislators/Staff:

Group Leader: We are meeting with you today to share our passion for afterschool, summer, and expanded learning and why New York State needs to prioritize afterschool investments to meet the field where they are at and equip them to support our young ones even better. I'd like to introduce you to everyone here with me today. <*Introductions, Name, Title, Organization*>

Group Leader: What experience have you had with afterschool or summer programs?

<Allow person to respond, and tailor messages below to build on their experiences or fill in gaps in their knowledge>

Program Providers: Take turns sharing your story in 2 minutes or less. Talk about your program and how it's supporting students as well as the community at-large. Share success stories and challenges you are facing (COVID-19 challenges, fiscal, not enough slots available/waiting list, etc.). If possible, invite the representative to join you later for a visit to your program.

Group Leader: As you have heard, these programs are making an incredible difference for youth, families, and communities in New York. Many of these programs have turned on a dime to support youth and families because they are committed to seeing their students and families succeed. Afterschool programs do so much with so little, and this year, we want you to equip them with more to do more. And so, we are asking New York State to restore the \$5 million cut to Advantage and provide \$169 million to align the three state afterschool funding streams-Advantage; Empire State, and Extended School Day/School Violence Prevention Programtowards true programming costs. We also ask that you increase Empire's per student rate to \$4,300 in the budget language so that programs can cover their costs better. Lastly, please dedicate a line-item fund of \$250,000 to increase the capacity of the Network for Youth Success to provide the crucial technical supports afterschool needs.

We've shared a link to a folder with a breakdown of our budget asks as well as the other budget asks our network is carrying to support expanded learning opportunities.

Group Leader: Thank you so much for taking the time out of your busy schedule to meet with us. We have really enjoyed meeting with you to share why afterschool, summer, and expanded learning opportunities are important to New York. Can we count on your support this year?
