Project: old project request - check with Wiss Trails for updates

Before February 2024, we'd like to build and install a few (not many, probably 2-4) nest boxes for American kestrels. Their populations have been taking a hit, partly due to habitat loss, and so we want to create spaces they can use during the breeding season. The two preserves where we've most frequently seen kestrels are our Willow Lake Farm and our Hughes Family Preserve at Briar Hill. There may be other spots, but those are what we're thinking of starting with.

The project would involve using designs that we have to build the nest boxes, and installing the boxes in the meadows at each preserve. We'd like the boxes to be on some sort of pulley system so that we can raise and lower them in order to monitor any nesting activity. That part isn't quite figured out, since it's not part of any nest box designs we've come across. We have had Eagle Scouts complete similar projects where they sourced the materials, organized a work day to build nest boxes, and then led the installation.

Project:

- No existing plans for Kiosks at various Preserves
- We'd be open to a new design, though, if researching that would be something a Scout might be interested in.

- The main things are that whatever is inside is shaded from the sun and enclosed, and there are brochure slots attached to the outside. Aside from the wasps getting in, our biggest problem is that the insides are annoying to add materials to (have been stapling things in, but it's tough to always have to pull out the staples and it start to look raggedly), so our thought was to add corkboard as the backing so we can just use push pins.
- We also want to retrofit the existing kiosks. Part of it might also include some improvements to our current kiosks (things like making them better-sealed so that wasps don't get it, easier to add and remove materials inside, etc.).
