Shirts	<u>Colors</u> • Solid colored shirt in white, blue, black, gray or burgundy or East Middle School “Approved” tops <u>Style/Types:</u> • Collared polo, button up tops, and solid (East approved colors) t-shirts. • East Middle School t-shirts, hoodies, and sweatshirts. <i>East Middle School "Approved" shirts include shirts with the East logo and/or shirts connected to an EMS sport or club (WEB, Student Council, etc) which can be purchased at East Middle School from the bookkeeper.</i>
Pants	<u>Colors:</u> • Pants/Bottoms must be solid color black or khaki. • Blue and Black denim jeans are also allowed. • Pants/Bottoms cannot have designs/patterns. • Side stripes are acceptable. <u>Styles/Types</u> • Pants • Jeans or soccer sweats • Joggers • Shorts, capris, skirts, dresses, jumpers (should be no more than 3 inches above the knee) • Leggings (Shirts should provide sufficient coverage of the backside. Leggings should not be see through) • Pants and tops should not reveal skin or undergarments
Sweatshirts / Hoodies	• Same colors as approved shirts (i.e. white, black, burgundy) or East Middle School “Approved” hoodie • May not wear hood while in the building
Shoes	• Flip-Flops, Slides, or slippers are not permitted.
Hats	• No hats, do-rags, sweatbands, or bandanas are allowed.
Coats/Jackets	• No coats or jackets should be worn in the classroom. (They may be worn between transitions to classrooms outside.)
Other:	• Gloves may not be worn in classrooms. • Pajamas and blankets are NOT permitted <u>except on designated Pajama Day(s)</u>. • The following clothing, insignias, accessories, jewelry, and grooming are NOT permitted: ○ Vulgar or profane

	○ Advocate racial, ethnic, religious prejudice or prejudice based on sexual orientation ○ Advocate gang affiliation ○ Advocate the use of tobacco, drugs or alcohol ○ Advocate violence to self or others
