Frederick L. Greenkorn, 52, of 1643 Georgia St., died at 3:30 a.m. today at Mercy Medical Center.

Mr. Greenkorn was born in Oshkosh Feb. 23, 1921, the son of Frederick J. and Josephine Greenkorn, and was married in Oshkosh to Beverly Luker on Sept. 12, 1946.

Starting at 16 years of age, he was employed by his grandfather and father at the Greenkorn Bottling Works and continued with the subsequent Pepsi-Cola Bottling Co. as sales manager until the time of death.

Mr. Greenkorn served in the Army in the European Theater during World War II, from August, 1942, to September, 1945. He was a member of the First English Lutheran Church, the American Legion, and the Oshkosh Elks Lodge.

Survivors are his widow; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick J. Greenkorn, Oshkosh; two daughters, Miss Mary Elizabeth Greenkorn, Highland Park, Ill., and Miss Paula June Greenkorn, Oshkosh, and a brother, Dr. Robert A. Greenkorn, Lafayette, Ind.

Cpl. Frederick L. Greenkorn, 841 Eighth street, entered service in 1942. He served in the battles and campaigns of central Europe, the air offensive over Europe, Normandy, northern France, Rhineland and Ardennes. His decorations and citations include the distinguished unit citation badge, the good conduct medal, the Belgium fourragere, the European-African service medal and two overseas service bars.
