Course Description:

This course is designed to develop students' skills in reading and writing at the elementary and pre-intermediate level. Main objective of this course is to improve students' skills and strategies learnt over the courses to become effective and critical readers and create original writing at their level through writing paragraphs. With the help of the reading coursebook, students are expected to acquire information about real people and places, experience the world and explore topics that matter and develop their ability to identify, analyze, and produce in a progressive way. The reading lessons cover a range of reading skills and vocabulary building activities. Another important aspect of the course is writing. Students are expected to write paragraphs on subjects identified and suggested by instructors. With this activity students will be able to express their thoughts, feelings, responses, attitudes and beliefs and they will also improve their writing style and skills. Students are also expected to improve their research skills by using libraries, online resources, magazines and newspapers. It helps students equip themselves with the ability to read and write more effectively to continue their university education with greater confidence.

Objectives

At the end of this course students will be able to:

- ✓ analyze, evaluate, and reflect on what they have read
- ✓ identify main idea(s) and specific details in a text
- distinguish main ideas from supporting details and facts from opinions.
- ✓ develop their comprehension and critical thinking abilities
- ✓ use the target vocabulary to develop reading and vocabulary skills
- ✓ recognize context clues to derive the meanings of unfamiliar words.
- paraphrase and summarize based on the information provided in the text.
- ✓ use a monolingual and/or bilingual dictionary to extend their vocabulary
- ✓ develop their reading strategies including scanning, skimming, detailed reading and note taking ...etc.
- identify the parts of speech in a text and use them appropriately
- ✓ analyze the elements of a paragraph and the writing process
