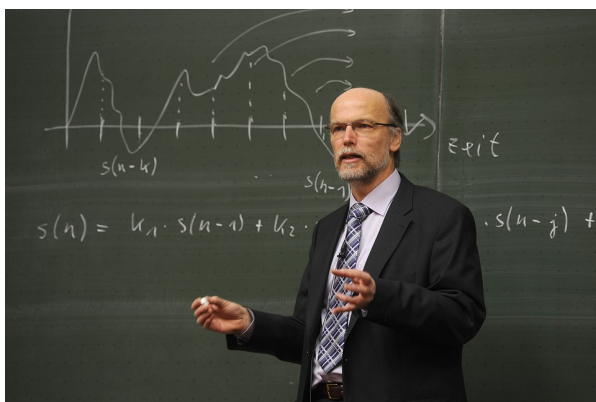


1.7 - Asking 'what kind' - *jaký*

If you want to ask 'What kind of _____?' in Czech, you use the word *jaký*. It is an adjective in form, and has all the same endings, as in the chart below:

masculine	feminine	neuter
<i>jaký</i>	<i>jaká</i>	<i>jaké</i>

Take a look at the following examples:



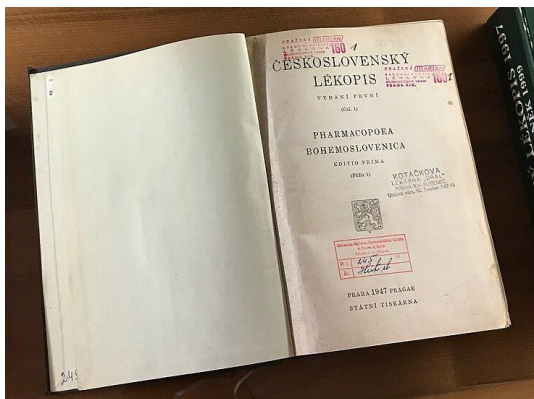
-Jaký je pan Novák profesor?
-Je dobrý profesor.

-What kind of professor is Mr. Novák?
-He's a good professor.



-Jaký je ten počítač?
-To je starý počítač.

-What kind of computer is this?
-This is an old computer.



-Jaká je ta kniha?



-Jaké je to auto?

-*To je stará kniha.*

-*To je staré auto.*

-What kind of book is that?

-What kind of car is this?

-That is an old book.

-This is an old car.

<i>jaký</i>	Use when the noun that is being asked about is masculine (animate and inanimate), as in the case of <i>profesor</i> or <i>počítač</i> above.
<i>jaká</i>	Use when the noun that is being asked about is feminine, as in the case of <i>kniha</i> above.
<i>jaké</i>	Use when the noun that is being asked about is neuter, as in the case of <i>auto</i> above.
