
1.7 - Asking 'what kind' - jaký

If you want to ask 'What kind of _____?' in Czech, you use the word *jaký*. It is an adjective in form, and has all the same endings, as in the chart below:

masculine	feminine	neuter
jaký	jaká	jaké

Take a look at the following examples:

- -Jaký je pan Novák profesor? -Je dobrý profesor.
- -What kind of professor is Mr. Novák? -He's a good professor.



-Jaká je ta kniha?

- -Jaký je ten počítač?
- -To je starý počítač.
- -What kind of computer is this?
- -This is an old computer.



-Jaké je to auto?

-To je stará kniha.

-To je staré auto.

-What kind of book is that?

-What kind of car is this?

-That is an old book.

-This is an old car.

jaký	Use when the noun that is being asked about is masculine (animate and inanimate), as in the case of <i>profesor</i> or <i>počítač</i> above.
jaká	Use when the noun that is being asked about is feminine, as in the case of <i>kniha</i> above.
jaké	Use when the noun that is being asked about is neuter, as in the case of <i>auto</i> above.
