

Meeting Moderator / Host Settings

Who is in control of the meeting?

- If the meeting is in a primary calendar of a user — that user.
- If the meeting is in a secondary or resource calendar or not in a calendar — the user who added the meet link in the calendar entry.
- 3. If the original creator doesn't exist any more nobody



This blue shield indicates moderator privileges in a meet

The **first** user who <u>arrives</u> at the meeting.

Users without the "create meetings" privilege cannot join as first user. They must wait for somebody (e.g. a teacher) with the privilege to join before them.

Moderator / Host

- Change Host Settings Control if users can join the meet, share their screen, send chat messages
- Mute and remove participants, approve joining requests
- Lower <u>raised hands</u>
- Create and manage <u>breakout rooms</u>, <u>polls</u> and <u>Q&A</u>
- Receive the <u>attendance report</u>
- Record or <u>live stream</u> the meeting (with suitable license and only if the meeting was created by a licensed user)

Google <u>suggests</u> to limit starting meetings to staff & teachers to protect meets from student control


Caveats

If your <u>school type is Primary or</u>
<u>Secondary education (K-12)</u>, you will not be allowed to join Google Meet video calls created by personal Google Accounts.

Anonymous users, or users not signed in to a Google Account, will not be able to join meetings organized by G Suite for Education users. However, users can still dial in using a phone.

To allow anonymous users to join meetings in their domain, the admin of the G Suite for Education domain can contact <u>Google</u> <u>Workspace support</u> and request an exception.

Participants (both in-domain and out of domain) who are removed from the meeting can't request access to re-join the meeting. If a participant's requests to join a meeting are denied twice, they won't be able to request to join the meeting again. In these cases, the meeting organizer can manually invite them back into the meeting.
