Website builders

What even is that?

- How many of you have heard of one of these?
 - Weebly
 - Squarespace
 - Wordpress
 - GoDaddy
 - Wix
- These are called website builders - they're tools you can use to make a website



How do they work?

- They're so cool omg
 - Step 1: Pick a "Template" (a starting point for your site that other people make to help you)
 - Step 2: Customize your template with your content (text, pictures, logos, videos, etc.)
 - Step 3: Make your site public
 - Step 4: Tell everyone about your awesome site and be proud of yourself

What a website builder is

- We've been writing HTML and CSS by hand (a valuable skill!)
- It turns out that many sites need a lot of the same things
 - Headers
 - Text
 - Pictures
 - Logos
- Website builders make it easy to lay this kind of content out without spending hours doing it over and over again
