4. Easily customize your preferred meeting invitation email address from your Individual Dashboard, ensuring that existing and new meetings are updated accordingly
5. Effortlessly share your meeting links with other participants or add them to a shared calendar. Only invited participants will have access to join private meetings through the shared link
