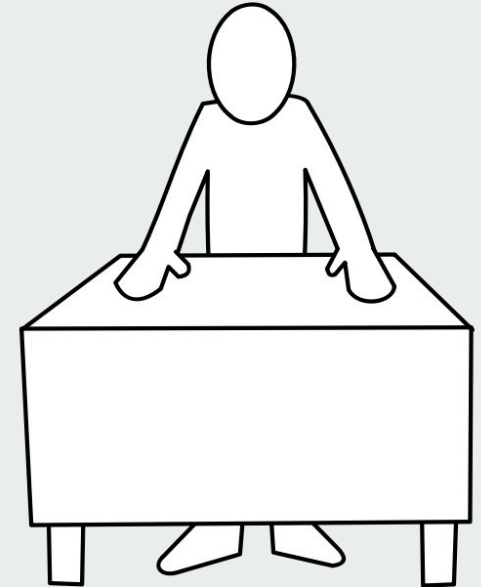

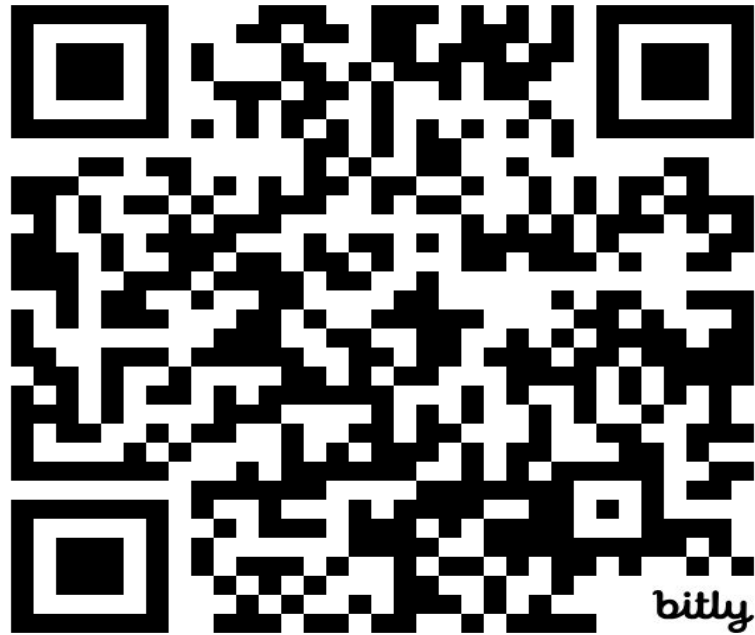

High School

If you want to enter the workforce immediately after high school....

- Most NC jobs want you to have education beyond high school
- Take advantage of CTE courses
- Earn an industry certification=

Certificate or Diploma

- Usually less than 8 classes
- Can start with CCP in high school!
- Graduate certified & ready to work!

UNC System updated minimum requirements

For students entering in the Fall 2025 or Spring 2026 semesters:

1. High School GPA: A minimum weighted GPA of 2.5.
2. Standardized Test Scores: Students with a weighted High School GPA greater than or equal to 2.50 and less than 2.80 are required to submit a standardized test score (ACT or SAT).

For students entering in the Fall 2026 semester and beyond:



1. High School GPA: A **minimum weighted GPA of 2.5.**
2. Standardized Test Scores: Students with a weighted High School **GPA greater than or equal to 2.50 and less than 2.80 are required to submit a standardized test score** of a 17 or higher on the ACT or a 930 or higher on the SAT.

Nuts & Bolts of Paying for College



(brief overview)

-10th grade IS NOT too early to learn

-Review slides 19 & 20 on your own time and with your parents

COA=direct costs + indirect costs

COA=Cost of Attendance

- Direct costs (tuition, fees, room, meal plan)
- Indirect costs (books, transportation, personal & misc.)

Types of Aid (Federal, state, institutional):

- Grants/Scholarships [FREE \$]
- Loans–YOU MUST PAY \$ BACK
- Workstudy–work on campus

Exhaust ALL K-12 options to pay

HOW TO SAVE & PAY FOR COLLEGE

Saving \$ & Paying options!

- 1) AP & Dual enrollment courses to earn college credit
- 3) Modern states-32 self-paced courses
- 4) CLEP exams
- 5) Guaranteed Transfer options from Community College to four-year colleges
 - See Special Admissions programs at WTCC
- 6) NC 529 College Savings Plan
- 7) FAFSA-unlocks federal & state aid
- 8) CSS Profile-non federal aid

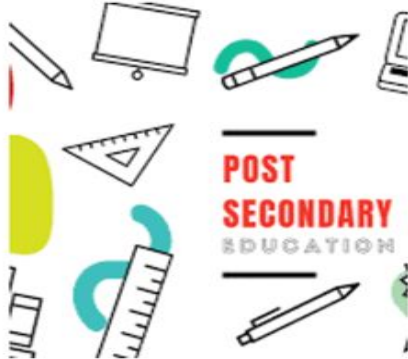

How are GPA and Ranking Calculated?

Letter Grade	Standard Course	Honors Courses	AP Courses
A (90 – 100)	4	4.5	5
B (80 – 89)	3	3.5	4
C (70 – 79)	2	2.5	3
D (60 – 69)	1	1.5	2
F (0 – 59)	0	0	0

How do I calculate my GPA? The GPA equation is the total number of quality points earned divided by the total number of course attempts (for grades 9 – 12 only... credits earned in middle school are not included in the GPA).

$$\frac{\text{Quality points (total) earned}}{\text{Credits attempted}} = \text{Grade Point Average}$$

English 2 H A=4.5

13.5 quality points/4 credits=**3.375 weighted GPA**

Math 2 H B=3.5

French 1 C=2.0

Drafting 1 H B =3.5

13.5 quality points

Make good grades—credit recovery not accepted

- 10th grade webpage

10th GRADE PLAN

- » If you're being actively recruited by an NCAA school and have a Profile Page account, **transition** it to the required **certification account**.
- » Monitor the **task list** in your NCAA Eligibility Center account for next steps.

- » At the end of the school year, ask your high school counselor from each school you attend to upload an official transcript to your Eligibility Center account.
- » If you fall behind academically, ask your high school counselor for help finding **approved courses** you can take.



Athletic Eligibility



Athletic Eligibility

- Meet NHSAA & WCPSS requirements

Attendance guidelines

- Age requirement, can't turn 19 on or before 8/31
- Requires 85% of attendance the semester prior
- Must be present the entire day in order to participate

Athletic guidelines

- Must earn passing grades in 3 of 4 classes the semester prior
- Cumulative Grade Point Average of 1.5 or higher
