Overview

- A BID is a type of municipal service district authorized by NC General Statutes
 that is defined by ordinance upon a finding that the district is in need of one or
 more defined services, facilities, or functions to a demonstrably greater extent
 than the remainder of the city.
- Following an organized advocacy effort, City Council took votes at their May 13, and June 11, 2024 meetings to establish the <u>BID boundary</u> and tax rate (.0877 per \$100 assessed valuation of taxable property).
- City Council also passed <u>a resolution</u> that outlines desired BID services, reporting and engagement requirements as well as the governance/advisory structure to be implemented by the operator.
- The City will administer a competitive Request for Proposals (RFP) process to contract with an operator/service provider to deliver the supplemental services within the district.
- Prior to issuing an RFP, staff is seeking from the public to further shape the service needs and priorities for the district.



Engagement

- Staff is seeking input on the service needs and priorities for the BID based on the following focus areas:
 - Safety & Hospitality: Ensuring a welcoming and secure environment for everyone
 - Enhanced Cleaning: Keeping our downtown clean and well-maintained
 - Special Projects: Undertaking initiatives that enhance the downtown experience
- Downtown Commission Working Group: feedback and involvement (throughout)
- Public Survey: Open through August 11, 2024 (<u>link to the survey</u>)
- Focus Group Meetings:
 - Downtown residential tenants
 - Downtown business tenants
 - Downtown workers
 - DARN
 - The Block/East End
 - Individuals experiencing homelessness
 - Service providers working with populations in need



Next Steps

- August 11, 2024: Survey closes and focus group meetings completed
- August 23, 2024: Downtown Commission to receive presentation on input and provide recommendations on key components of service priorities/content of the RFP
- September 9, 2024: City staff provide overview of input received and proposed content of RFP to City Council's Planning & Economic Development Committee
- September 2024: RFP Process launched
- Fall 2024: Evaluation of proposals and contractor selection
- Fall/Late 2024: City Council contract authorization and finalizing of contract
- January 2024: Contracted BID Service Provider operational THECIT
