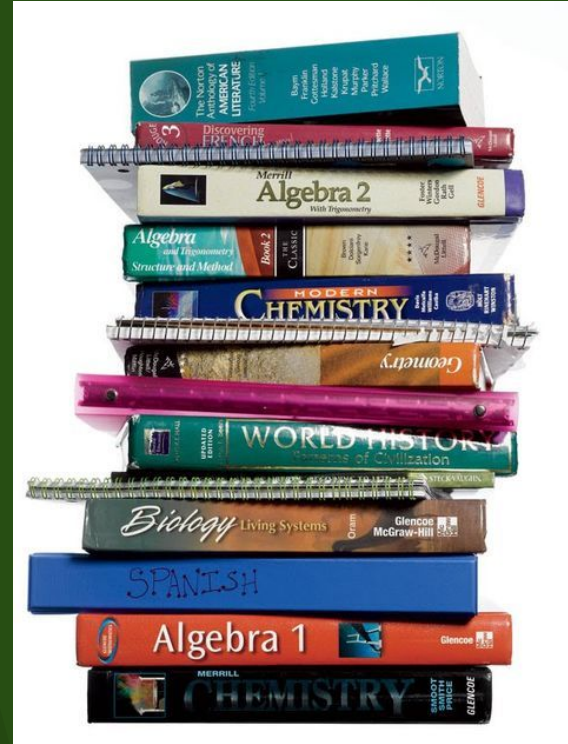

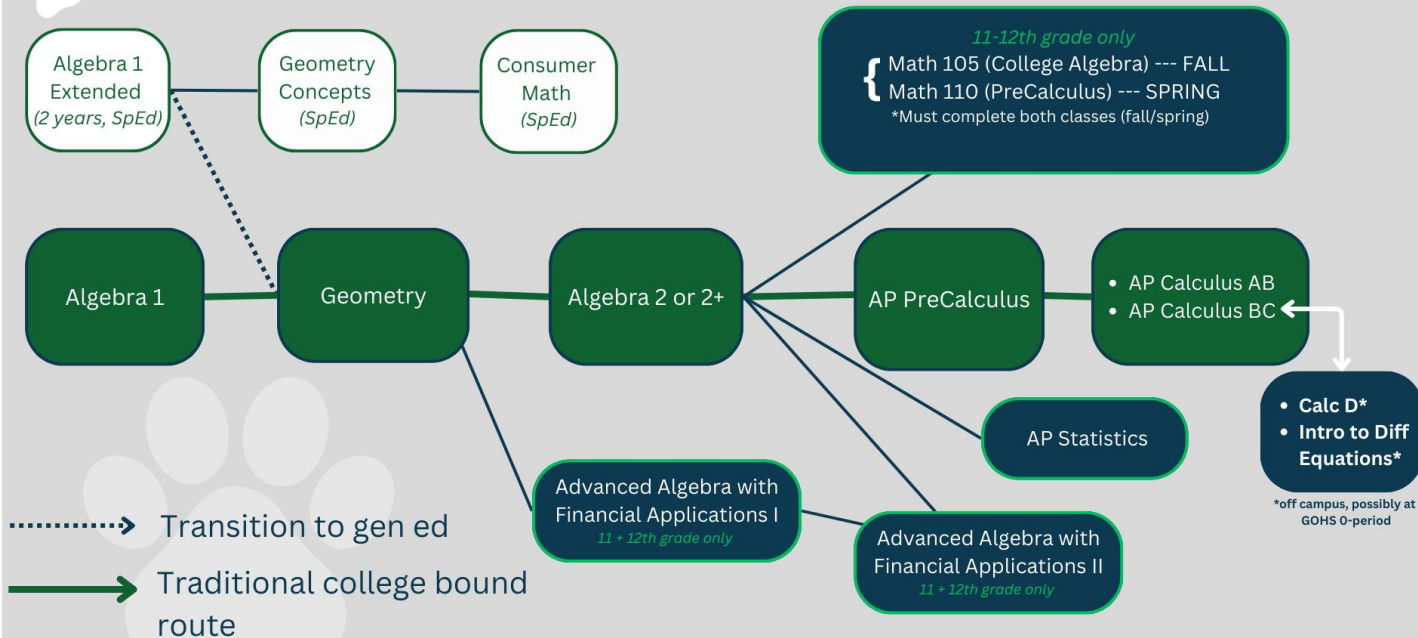

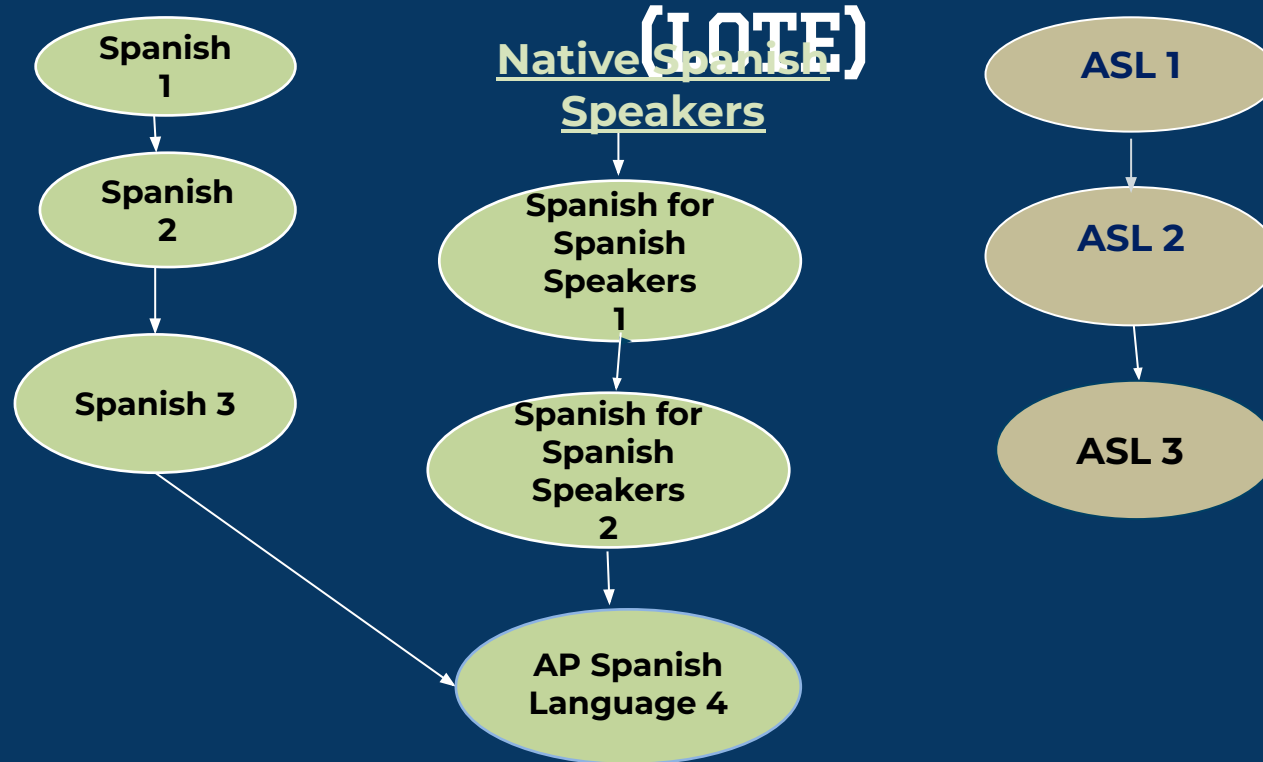

SENIOR ONLY OPPORTUNITIES

Early Release or Late Start - No Credit

- ▶ Must have min of 145 credits now
- ▶ Must have 175 credits at the start of fall semester & 200 credits at the start of spring semester
- ▶ No double release, must have 5 in person classes
- ▶ **Early Release/Late Start Contract w/ parent signature is required**

Teacher Assistant (TA) - Pass/Fail

- ▶ TA minimum requirements:
 - ▷ 2.0 GPA
 - ▷ No truancies
 - ▷ No discipline or attendance referrals
 - ▷ No academic dishonesty, forgery or suspensions
- ▶ Only 1 period of TA per semester allowed
- ▶ **TA Contract w/ parent signature & Teacher signature is required**
- ▶ Assignments are based on availability

SENIOR ONLY OPPORTUNITIES

Keep In Mind...

- ▶ The strength of your Senior schedule will be taken into consideration as part of the 4-year college admissions process. (TA & Release Periods are considered to be a “missed academic opportunity” by college admission evaluators).
- ▶ Seniors who sign up for TA, Early Out, Late Start or Work Experience MUST maintain a minimum 2.0 GPA, avoid discipline referrals, stay off the “No Go” List, and maintain acceptable attendance. These classes are a privilege not a right.

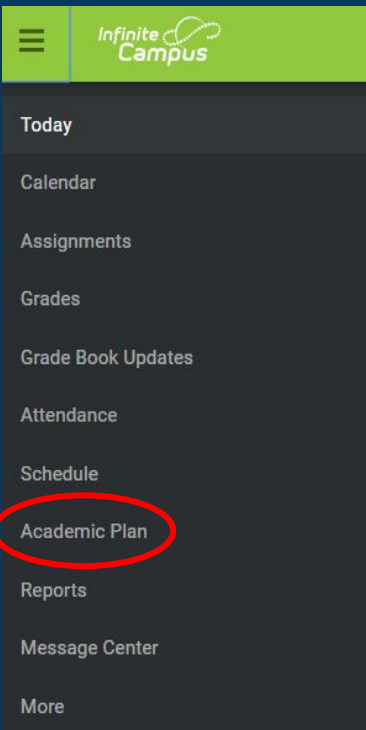
