Your Exams Admission Slip

Your **Exam Code** and **NSN** are printed at the top right-hand corner of the Admission Slip.

Exam code: This is used by the exam supervisor to place you in the correct seat with your correct booklets.

NSN (National Student Number): This is your number for every year you enter national qualifications. Use this number to create a learner account on the NZQA website: www2.nzqa.govt.nz/login/create-account/. You will be able to view your personal and entry details, log into digital exams (when applicable) and access your marked exams.

ARRIVING FOR EXAMS

Make sure that you arrive at the exam room by the **Report Time** shown on the other side of this page. This will give you time to get ready for the exam.

EXAM SESSION

The name of the exam session, (e.g. NCEA L1 Chemistry & Biology) may not be the same name as the course you are doing at school (e.g. NCEA L1 Science). Check the standard numbers displayed under the exam sessions.

NZQA EXAMS

By entering for NZQA external assessment you have agreed to follow all Rules and Instructions for Candidates on the Candidate Information Sheet and the NZQA Assessment (including exams) Rules: www2.nzqa.govt.nz/about-us/rules-fees-policies/nzqa-rules/#e10678_heading1

NZQA will investigate any reported possible breach of the rules. There may be a penalty for a breach.

REMINDERS FOR CANDIDATES

- **If you arrive after the official start time of the exam, the time is not added at the end. If you arrive more than 30 minutes after the official start time of the exam you will NOT be able to sit the exam.**
- Follow all instructions of any exam supervisor.
- All work you submit for marking must be your own.
- You **must** write your exam answers in the NZQA answer booklets or on the extra paper given to you by a supervisor. Please ensure you **do not** write in the clearly defined margins on the NZQA answer booklet, as this area may be cut off when the booklet is marked.
- Draw a cross through the box on the front page of any unused answer booklets to indicate you have not written anything inside (and ensure you have drawn a line through any answers you may have started, if you do not want them to be marked) and place them in a separate pile on your desk to be collected by the supervisor at the end of the exam.
- If you switch to the paper exam from digital, you cannot switch back to the digital exam.
- Answers for digital exams must only be submitted via the NZQA digital exam platform.

IN AN EXAM, YOU ARE NOT ALLOWED TO:

- Talk to, communicate with, or disturb other candidates.
- Copy other candidates' work.
- Access any internet site except the assessment platform and the NZQA website (to log into it).
- Communicate with the marker, including writing or drawing anything that could be viewed as offensive.
- Leave the exam room within the first 45 minutes or the last 15 minutes of the exam.
- Touch or open any emergency evacuation pack without the permission of a supervisor.

TAKE THE FOLLOWING INTO THE EXAM ROOM:

- Your Exams Admission Slip. **Do not write on it in any way, at any time.**
- A see-through pencil case or a clear plastic bag to hold your pens and pencils, to use if needed.
- Blue or black pens.

Admission slip rules

- You **MUST** bring it to every exam - keep it safely in a plastic sleeve or pocket. You will not be allowed in to the exam without it.
- You **MUST NOT** write on it.
- You must not share it with anyone else.
- If you forget it, student services has **ONE** spare copy. After that you will need to go to the library when you arrive, login to your **NZQA** site and print off another one. In either case you will need to get me or Rebecca (DP) to sign it. At least one of us will be in the foyer area before each exam.
- Please read all the rules and regulations on the back of your slip, as well as the Candidate information sheet which your rōpū teacher will give you.

When you get your admission slip, you will need to check it has all the exams on it that you are expecting to sit

If you were entered for exams you no longer intend to sit, that is fine. You just don't turn up for the exam.

If you were entered after 26th August, the exam may not appear on your sheet and you will need to print another one - go to your NZQA site to do this and then come and get me to sign it.

If you think you should be entered for an exam and it isn't on your sheet, it's probably too late but please check with your subject teacher first and then come and see me **at the start of next week.**

If you need to print a new admission slip or you are doing a digital exam, you must log on to your learner login on the NZQA website. All of you should have an NZQA site which for you know your email address and password.

Create An Account

If you haven't logged in before, you will need to know your National Student Number (NSN) to complete your account creation.

Special Assessment conditions

If you are entitled to SAC, please make sure you have talked to Ms Hannagan about what you need before you go on study leave.

On the day of each exam, go to Level 4 and check the board in the open level to find out where your exam is.

If you have SAC that includes a reader or a writer, please let Ms Hannagan know beforehand if you are not going to turn up. We don't want to be paying supervisors who are not needed and they may be able to be used elsewhere.

A reminder about rules for the exams

Phones must be off and either left in your bag at the back or put in a plastic bag under your exam desk



Watches are not allowed to be worn and electronic ones must be turned off and left in your bag at the back

No hats, hoodies or heavy outdoor coats with lots of pockets can be worn in the exam



You may bring a water bottle (water only) but it must be in a totally clear plastic bottle



Emergency pack

If there is an emergency and we have to evacuate, you will not be able to collect your bags from the back of the hall. You can have an emergency pack under your exam desk with your phone (turned off), a snapper card or money, door key etc - things that will allow you to get home if you can't return to the exam room. **Everything must be in a clear plastic bag.**



MASKS



Masks are not compulsory in exams. The choice is yours. However, if you have a slight cold or cough, the ECM may require you to wear one for the protection of others. Masks will be provided if you want one.

Derived Grades

Please be really clear that you cannot claim a derived grade just because you did well in the DGE and you're happy with that grade!



If you are ill on the day of an exam, or suffer some traumatic event, you can apply for a derived grade - if you have one - from the school exams. Please send an email with details to Rebecca Rapira-Davies or see her in person. You will need a medical certificate for an illness. If you have covid, it will be treated the same as any other illness. The only difference is, if you register your illness with the Ministry of Health, you can provide us with the text from them acknowledging your COVID-19 result instead of a doctor's certificate.
