

The LRDV system monitors graduation, dropout, and other leaver data submitted to the Texas Education Agency (TEA) and identifies data anomalies that require school systems to validate the accuracy of their data and, as necessary, improve local data reporting procedures or address program implementation concerns.

### **School Safety and Security Update**

SB 546: Required Reporting on School Bus Seat Belt Costs

### **OVERVIEW**


Not later than the end of the 2025-2026 school year, Senate Bill 546 (89th Regular Legislative Session) requires school systems that make a budget limitation determination under Transportation Code, \$547.701(e)(1), to submit to TEA the estimated cost to equip each bus operated by and/or contracted for use by the district with three-point seat belts.

### REPORTING IN SENTINEL

School systems are *required to submit* the information requested, with supporting documentation.

- Report estimated cost through Sentinel
- Starting on Tuesday, November 11, 2025 through Friday, May 29, 2026
- If a school system board has determined that its budget does not permit the district to purchase or contract buses that are equipped with three-point seat belts (required in Transportation Code, §547.701), the following must be presented in a public meeting:
  - The number of buses operated by or contracted for use by the school system that are not equipped with seat belts, the number that are equipped with two-point seat belts, and the number that are equipped with three-point seat belts; and
  - The estimated cost to equip each bus operated by and/or contracted for use by the school system with three-point seat belts

- EDGAR is the United States
   Department of Education's
   compilation of administrative
   requirements for grants (includes
   2 CFR 200 Uniform Grant
   Guidelines)
- Governs all federal grants awarded by USD

### **Did You Need to Know?**

- Federal, state, or local rules that are most restrictive in nature must be followed regardless of whether the most restrictive is state or local.
- Federal Regulations (EDGAR & UGG)
- State Regulations (UGMS/TxGMS & FASRG)
- Programs are NOT Funding Sources

### Two Types of Federal Funds

### **Federal Formula Funds**

- Budget Period One Year
- Performance Period 15 Month
- Carryover 12 Additional Months

### **Discretionary Funds**

- Budget Period One Year
- Performance Period Typically 3-5 years
- No Tydings Amendment, i.e., the period of availability is over at the end of performance period unless no cost extension is approved.

- Conduct Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA)
  - Address Identified Needs
- Plan for Interventions & Implementation Examine & Reflect

### **Internal Controls**

- Prevents Fraud, Waste and Abuse
  - Increases Accountability

### Risk Rating Indicators

The purpose of an annual risk assessment is to determine and mitigate any potential risk of noncompliance. Based on the outcome of the annual risk assessment, subrecipients are assigned a risk status of low, medium, or high.

### Risk Indicators to be reintroduced for 2025-2026 Risk Assessment Process

- High carryover of grant funds
  - Lapsed grant funds
- Concerns regarding the timely drawdown of grant funds
- Large amount of federal expenditures compared to total operating costs


