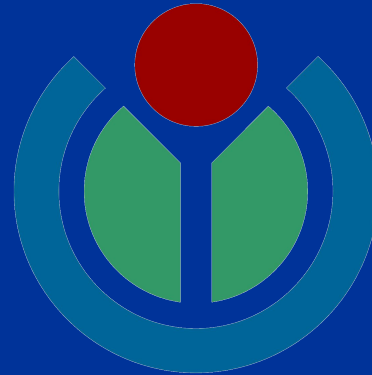

Use of generative artificial intelligence

- GenAI can be used with acknowledgement in Wikiversity edit summary and a link to the shared conversation
- Then human rewrite genAI material to improve, fact check, and provide citations to the best peer-reviewed literature
- Upload genAI images with appropriate acknowledgement to Wikimedia Commons and embed on chapter page
- Unacknowledged GenAI use breaches academic integrity

Use of generative artificial intelligence

Summary of steps

1. **Prompt** to generate text using a genAI tool and create a shared link to the conversation
2. **Paste** and publish text on book chapter page with an acknowledgement and link to conversation in the edit summary
3. **Fact check and rewrite** the genAI material to improve it, with citations to the best peer-reviewed literature
