
Setting up your Chromebook

The first time you turn on your Chromebook, you will set these up. You only need to do this once.

- 1. **ChromeVox** > option to turn on screen reader
- 2. Wi-Fi connection > choose the name of the internet connection
- 3. **Google terms of service** > permission to send information to Google to help improve Google operating system features and performance
- Google Assistant > option to use your voice to ask Google for information. It will ask for your permission.
- 5. **Connect to your phone** > you might see this if you have an Android phone
- 6. You are all set






Desktop Fullscreen and half screen








Mouse How to hold a mouse
