12		power on, wake up

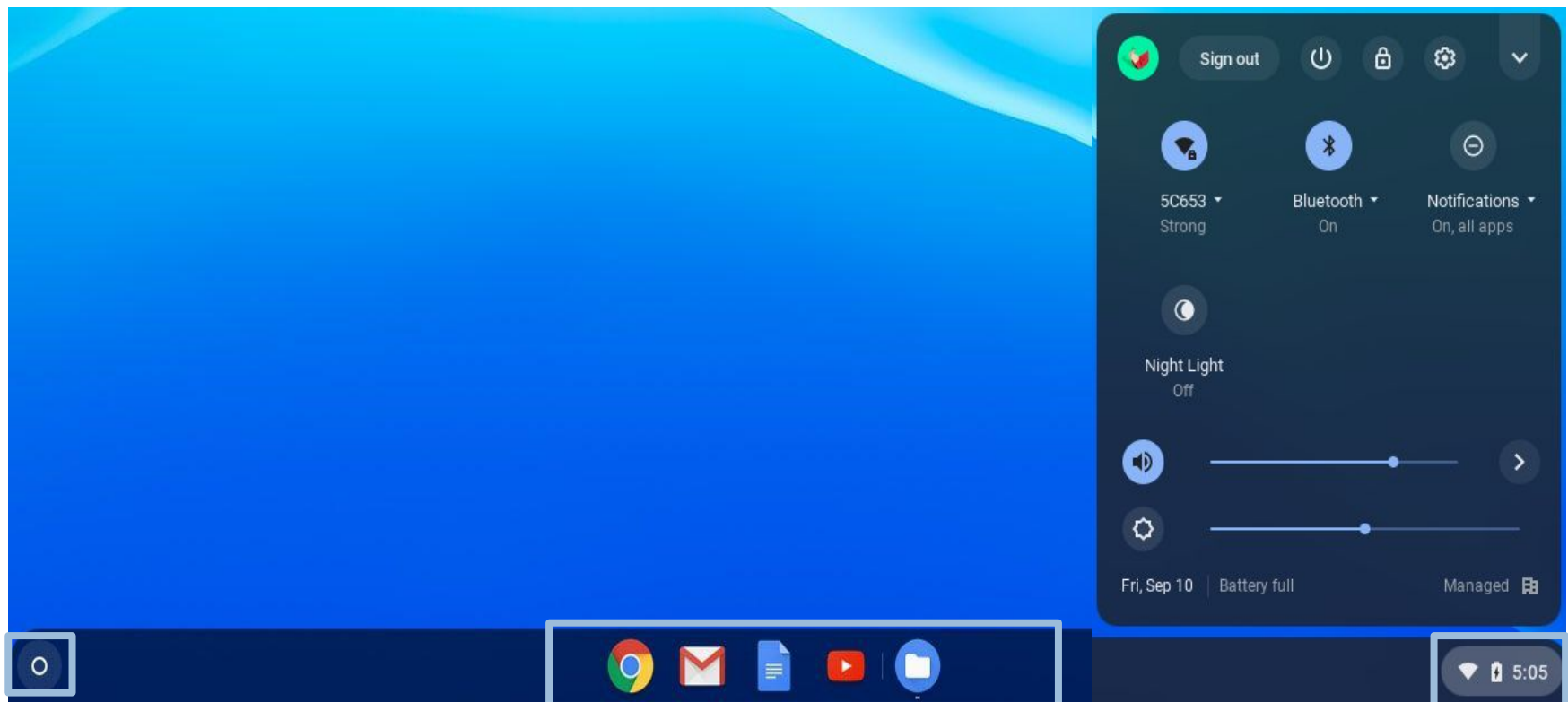
# Setting up your Chromebook

The first time you turn on your Chromebook, you will set these up. You only need to do this once.

1. **ChromeVox** > option to turn on screen reader
2. **Wi-Fi connection** > choose the name of the internet connection
3. **Google terms of service** > permission to send information to Google to help improve Google operating system features and performance
4. **Google Assistant** > option to use your voice to ask Google for information. It will ask for your permission.
5. **Connect to your phone** > you might see this if you have an Android phone
6. **You are all set**
