Implementing a Peer Advising Program for Students in the College of Natural Sciences During New Student Orientation

Legislative Executive Summary

Current students offer a unique perspective on the first-year experience that CNS acudemic advisors may not be able to provide. Many incoming feedmen and transfer students lack contact with current students at UT. The implementation of a pere advising program during orientation will provide incoming students with a formalized time and space to agin insight on the new student experience and recommendations regarding acudemic matters, from students who have undertaken or are currently undertaking a similar course of study. The purpose of this pixel of legislation is to establish a framework for the creation of a pere advising program within the College of Natural Sciences during New Student Orientation. 
Mandates NSC's involvement in developing the *new* CNS Wellness Center through data analysis, community advocacy, and discussion with faculty and staff


