






Kevin Snipes

Kevin Snipes is a *ceramicists* based in Cleveland, Ohio.

He makes his **ceramics** out of porcelain clay and **cut out shapes** and **adds texture** to the pieces to emphasize the figure he puts on them later.

He leaves the figures **uncolored** for his audience to see themselves in his art. He didn't want to represent one race. He makes his figures childlike to maintain the innocence of his art.



Dry by tapping paintbrush on paper towel.




Paint charm - swish, swish with the tip of the bristles.
