



PARENT INFORMATION FOR NEW KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS

How you can help your child succeed...



- Students will be learning basic daily routines the first few weeks of school so please practice with your child how to follow simple 3-step directions (i.e. put on coat and shoes, get backup, stand by door).
- Students need to come to school on time everyday. Tardiness disrupts the classroom routine and learning environment.



Lost and Found

Please label all of your child's belongings with their name! We help pair up missing belongings to their owner.





SCHOOL SUPPLIES

- Backpacks must be large enough to hold folders and books without bending. Your child will be responsible for emptying their backpack - we are trying to foster independence.
- Please see the supply list that will be updated on our website.



BUS TRANSPORTATION

- Patrols are on each bus to assist the students.
- A parent or guardian should be present at the bus stop to receive their child.
- Be patient with the school bus schedule. Occasionally the bus may arrive a few minutes late especially the first week.



WALKERS AND CAR RIDERS

 Children are to line up daily outside the entrance near the kindergarten classrooms.



- The doors are opened at 8:55 a.m. and the children are to line up quietly outside the kindergarten classrooms next to the cones with their teacher's name (if possible).
- Patrols and adults will monitor the children until teachers bring them into the classroom at 8:55 a.m.



LUNCH

- When your child buys lunch they will need to use their individual pin number. Please have you child practice their PIN number.
- If your child brings lunch, please label their lunch box
- We encourage you to pack a healthy snack for your child. Oftentimes children get hungry in the am or pm, depending on when their lunchtime is and what their eating schedule is. It is beneficial to begin working on having your child eat on a regular schedule during the summer to help eliminate any hunger discomfort that may rise.

SPECIALS (ART, MUSIC, PE AND MEDIA CENTER)

Each teacher/classroom has their own schedule.

RECESS

- Students have an opportunity to socialize and play daily at recess (indoors or outdoors).
- Kindergarten have a variety of play equipment and games to engage in during recess time.
- Support staff are on the playground at all times for safety and to help solve any peer conflicts that may arise.
- Indoor recess during inclement weather (i.e. icy, cold, unsafe conditions)

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?



- Build independence with everyday activities such as dressing, shoe tying, and being responsible for clothes.
- If your child is a bus rider, put them on the bus the first day.
- Encourage collaboration, persistence, intellectual risk taking, originality.
- Practice lunchbox know-how.
- Listen, talk, explore, read, and think mathematically.

VOLUNTEERING



- During the year there will be opportunities to volunteer within and outside the classroom.
- Please stay tuned for volunteer opportunities to come home in your child's take-home folder in the fall. (you can also check the MCPS website)
- Westbrook provides a volunteer orientation and training in collaboration with the PTA each year.
- MCPS requires all regular volunteers to complete the online Child Abuse and Neglect (CAN) Training.
