

The Process

A How-To Guide

Lots of research

- Google it! Not much out there in 2018 (especially for HS) but there's more now!
- Learn from those who have gone before.

2. Do a time study

- I realized that most librarians were either genrefying over summer or during a renovation. Not me!
- Think through your process and grab about 10 books. Do the whole thing. Multiply that by however many books you have.
- Ex. Mine was about 7 min./book with about 2500 fiction books

3. Decide which genres work best for your collection and patrons

- Again, this is where doing your research beforehand will help.
- I decided on:
 - General
 - Classics
 - Sports

- Mystery
- Fantasy
- Science Fiction
- Romance
- Historical
- Thriller, Horror, and Suspense

4. Weed and Separate

- How long has it been? You're going to touch every book anyway.
- Close the library for a day or two and starts making piles OR
- Take one shelf of books at a time.

Notes on Choosing

What's the most obvious choice?

If it's a toss-up between genres, choose the more obvious one, OR the one you think the students will be more excited about. Where are your gaps?

Once you start to rearrange titles by genre, your gaps become painfully apparent. If there's a toss-up, put it in the one with more shelf space.

 Don't sweat about it.

You aren't marrying your choice. You can change! It's just a sticker and a call number.

A How-To Guide

5. Sticker Up!

- You can sticker and then catalog (like I did) OR catalog when you sticker.
- I knew it would take me MONTHS to complete this project, so I went ahead and reshelved my library by genre, then went back shelf by shelf to change the call number.
- My saving grace is that I didn't change the spine label.
- I use DEMCO color tinted label protectors 7/8x1¼ (SKU 12813770)


6. Change the call number in your catalog

- My call numbers all have shortened genres
- GEN, CL, MYS, FAN, SF, ROM, HF, SPO, THR, HOR, SUS
- F GARBER becomes F GARBER FAN in the OPAC


