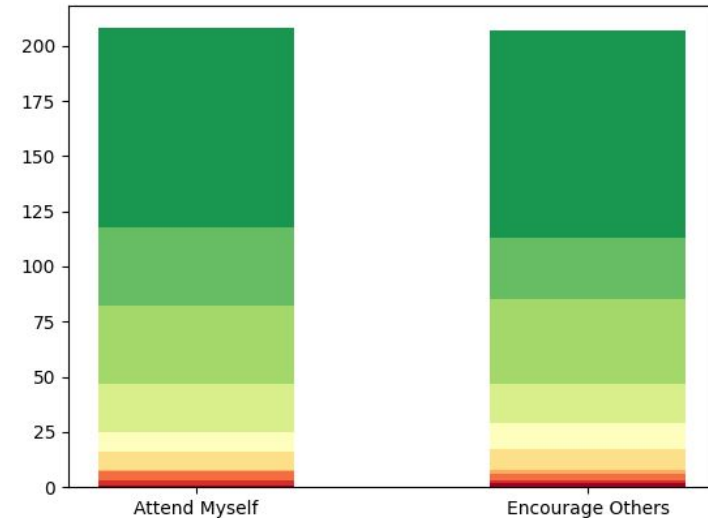

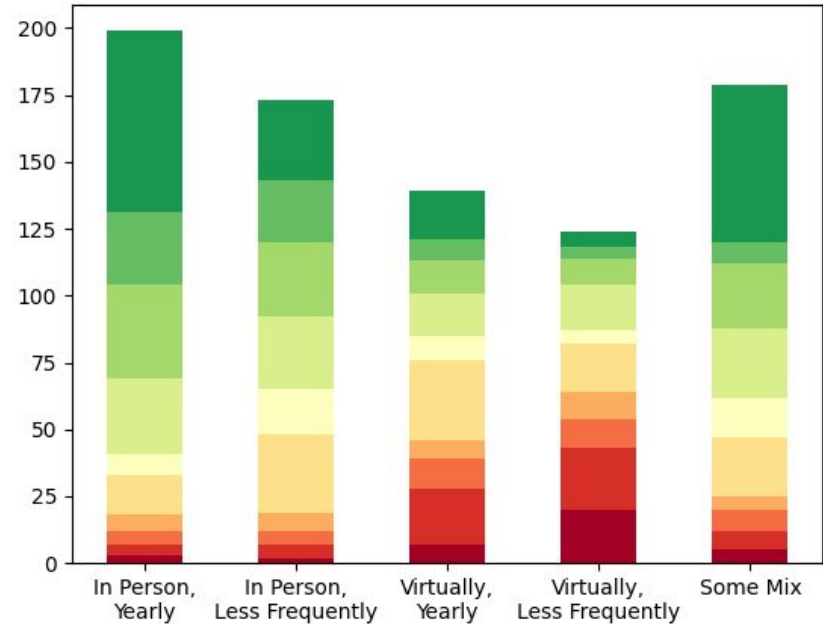
Survey Findings

- 560 responses
- Overall positivity about such an effort
- Not surprising given self-selection, but good to hear
- Why would people value a SIGCHI-sponsored health conference?
 - Health specific publication standards and formats
 - Better external visibility
 - Better conference experience
 - Better reviews/publication scope
 - Better networking, community-building



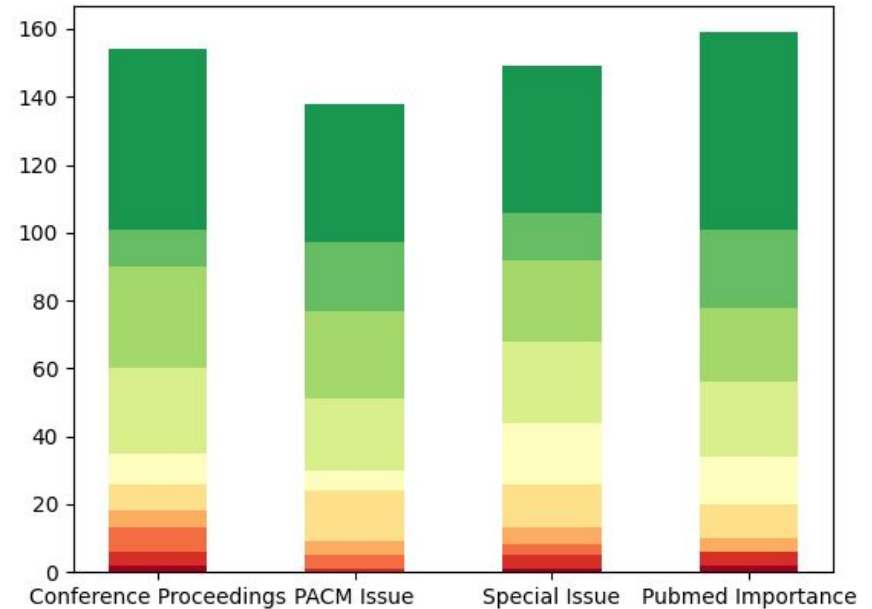
Survey Findings

- Conference Format: a range of preferences on format, but less interest in fully virtual format
- Considerations around Yearly vs ???
 - Cost (economic, social, environmental)
 - Prestige matters
 - Location + bias global north



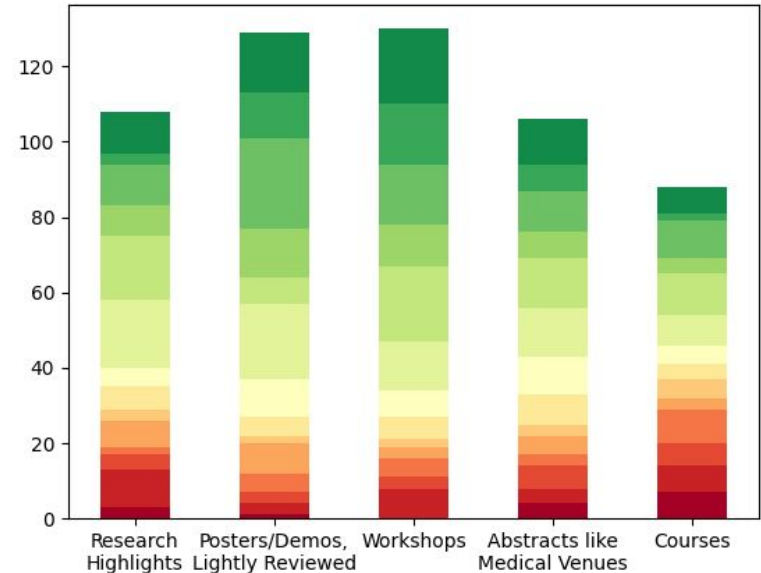
Survey Findings

- Overall positivity around all forms of publication processes
- Some stated concerns:
 - Legibility to clinical health audiences
 - Indexing in PubMed



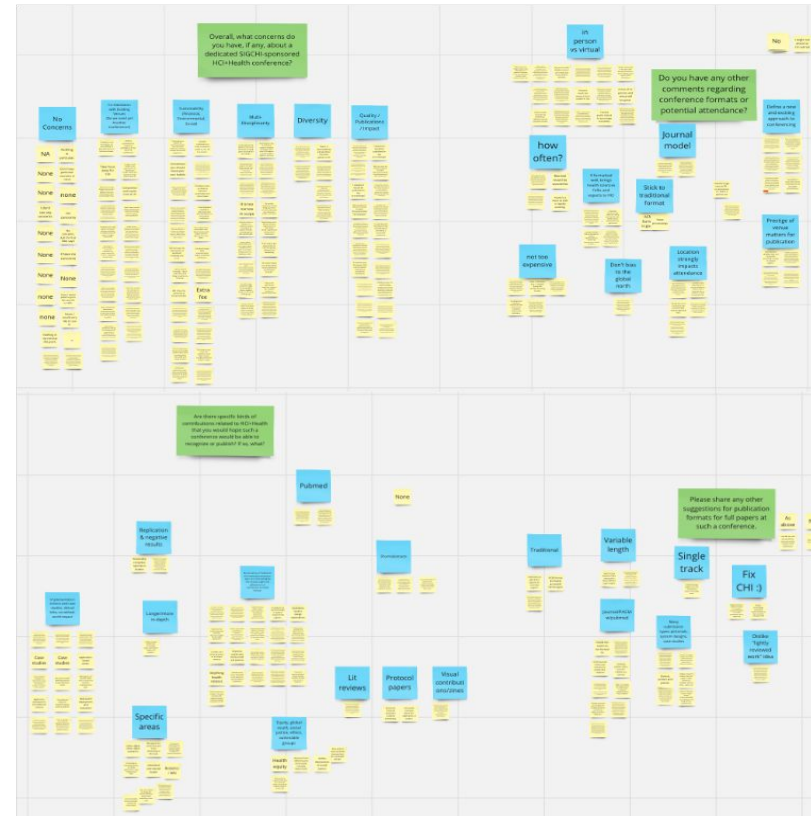
Survey Findings

- Desire for different presentation alternatives, but no consensus.
 - Desire for different kinds of contributions
 - Lit reviews, protocol papers, case studies, replication studies, short papers and abstracts

Overall, what concerns do you have, if any, about a dedicated SIGCHI-sponsored HCI+Health conference?

- Cohabitation with Existing Venues
 - *“extracting the understanding of health from mainstream HCI venues, such as CHI, CSCW etc. segregating the community.”*
- Sustainability (Financial, Environmental, Social)
 - *“Volunteer drain; conference overload / potentially even more travel”*
 - *“Increased review load, environmental impact of another conference.”*
- Multidisciplinarity
 - *“need to identify the focus topics; have a sufficient cover to reach a minimum dynamics and bring enough people avoid overlap with existing conferences”*
- Diversity
 - *“Geographic specificity. Given the heterogeneity of healthcare systems in the world, I would not want the research to be too US-centric.”*
- Quality / Publications / Impact
 - *“How well the conference gain a high impact factor in the short term.”*
 - *“What would be the selection criteria for paper? Who would evaluate the effectiveness of this conference?”*
- No concerns

Do you have any other comments regarding conference formats or potential attendance?

- In person vs. virtual
- How often? (e.g., biennial, yearly)
- Define a new and exciting approach to conferencing
- If formatted well, brings health sciences folks and experts to HCI
- Stick to traditional format (e.g., have proceedings)
- Journal model
- Not too expensive (registration cost)
- Don't bias to the global north
- Location strongly impacts attendance
- Prestige of venue matters for publication
 - *“the venue would need to reach the level of prestige of CHI/CSCW/UbiComp fast to encourage authors to submit here instead of those venues! The leaders could help enable this by encouraging high profile researchers to submit to the initial conference.”*

Are there specific kinds of contributions related to HCI+Health that you would hope such a conference would be able to recognize or publish? If so, what?

- Broad variety of traditional HCI methods/contribution types, but acknowledging that novelty might look different b/c of contribution to health domain
 - *“I hope we can appreciate as much the insights to HCI as well as the specific contributions to the health domain. This is currently in a limbo in terms of research, with some specific journals as sole alternatives. This is sad for those of us working at the boundary of fields.”*
- Implementation science and case studies, clinical folks, social/real-world impact (translational impact)
- Specific areas (e.g., robotics, disability, emotional health)
- Equity, global south, social justice, ethics, vulnerable groups
- PubMed
- Short/ Abstracts
- Protocol papers
- Replication & Negative Results
- Lit reviews
- Visual contributions

- Hybrid Journal Conference Setup (Journal/PACM w/PubMed)
 - *“I think the it would be interesting to look at a hybrid journal conference setup. Other disciplines, e.g. medicine, do not take conference publications as seriously. HCI researchers working in health need that respect. So I would suggest a journal with an associated conference presentation for discussion and networking. Would be a great deal. CSCW have an interesting setup with several yearly deadlines. ToCHI is a journal in which some publications are admitted to present at CHI.”*
- Many submission types: pictorials, system designs, case studies
- Traditional: short/long papers
- Variable length
- Fix CHI
 - e.g., separate submission timeline, encourage good statistical practice
- Single track
- Dislike "lightly reviewed work" idea
