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Built-in Accessibility in Chromebooks (Two Ways)

1. Go to the three lines in the top right hand corner 
2. Click on settings
3. Scroll to the bottom and click on show advanced settings
4. Scroll down and look for the words Accessibility

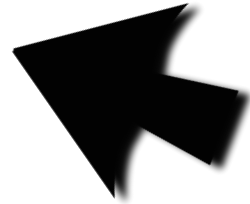

Enable accessibility features to make your device easier to use. [Learn more](#)

- Show accessibility options in the system menu
- Show large mouse cursor
- Use high contrast mode
- Enable sticky keys (to perform keyboard shortcuts by typing them sequentially)
- Enable ChromeVox (spoken feedback)
- Enable screen magnifier
 - Keep magnifier focus centered on screen
- Enable tap dragging
- Automatically click when the mouse pointer stops
 - Delay before click:
- Enable on-screen keyboard

***Show large mouse cursor**

When enabled the mouse arrow is larger



*Use high contrast color

This options reverses light and dark colors on the screen. Changing colors makes the screen easier for some.

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***Use sticky keys**

When enabled - you can use shortcuts and command keys by pressing them sequentially rather than simultaneously.

For example - to open files you can click Alt + Shift +M together for this command to work; with sticky keys you would first enable the sticky keys then press the keys in order (not together)

***Use spoken feedback-ChromeVox**

ChromeVox enables you to use your keyboard to explore the web with the help of synthesized speech. You can stop ChromeVox from talking at any time by pressing the Control key.

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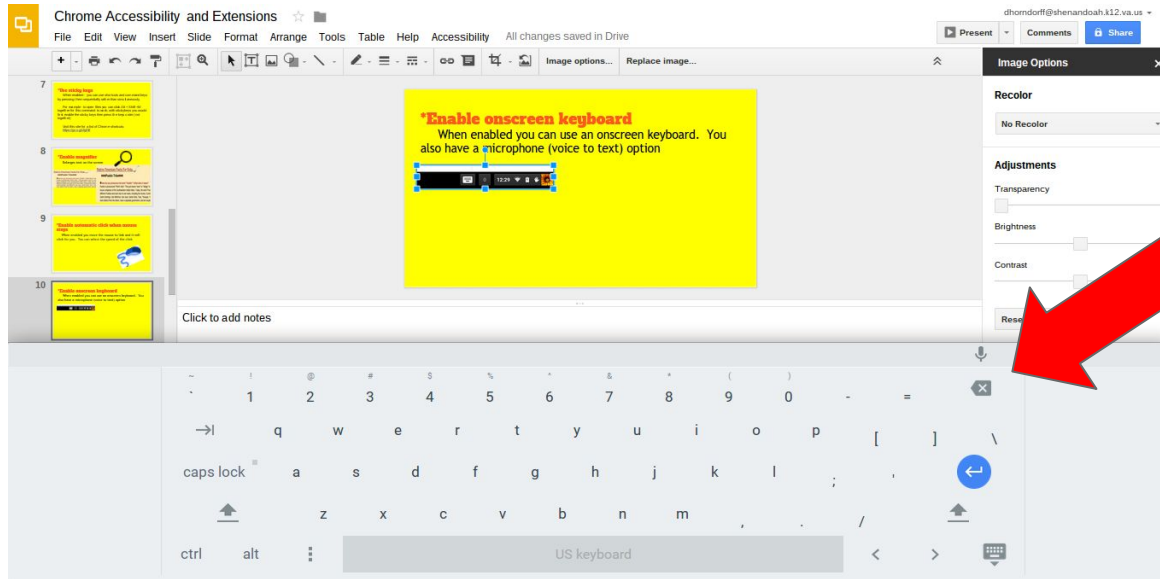
***Enable automatic click when mouse stops**

When enabled you move the mouse to link and it will click for you. You can select the speed of the click



*Enable onscreen keyboard

When enabled you can use an onscreen keyboard. You will see a small keyboard icon on the bottom right of your screen.



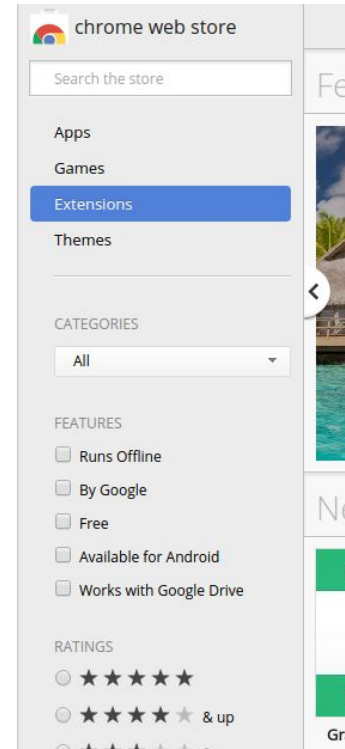
You also have a microphone (voice to text) option

Where to find extensions?

1. Go to the Chrome Store

2. In the search box type the extension you are looking for
3. Always read reviews to see if that is the type of functionality you are looking for
4. Click add to chrome, the add extension
5. It will now appear beside omnibox



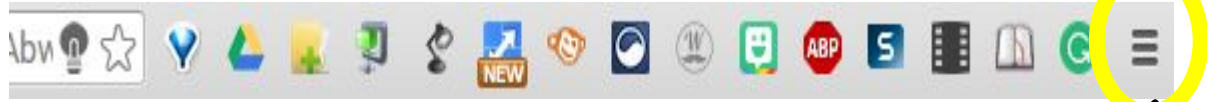
Where Are My Extensions

Managing Your Extensions

Go to the **three stacked line beside your extensions(my students call it the short stack of pancakes)



Click on **More Tools

Click on **Extensions

From here you can **disable, enable, or trash** extensions

Download the Extension called **Extensity**

This extensions allows you to enable and disable all your Chrome Extensions with one click.





MagicScroll

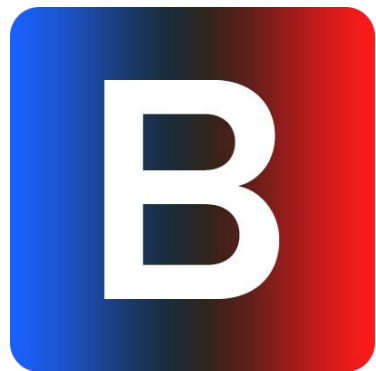
The MagicScroll Web Reader turns every page on the web into a MagicScroll book.

Its unique scrolling system lets you scroll web pages without moving them, making it easier to read long articles without being distracted.



Readability

Readability is a web and mobile app that zaps clutter and saves web articles in a comfortable reading view



Beeline Reader

BeeLine uses a color gradient to guide your eyes from the end of one line to the beginning of the next.



Select text you want to read and listen to it. SpeakIt converts text into speech so you no longer need to read. When you right click on the extension you can view options.

Kami

View, annotate, share and collaborate your files on Chrome. Kami (formerly Notable PDF).



Google Dictionary

View definitions easily
as you browse the web.

Color Enhancer

A customizable color filter applied to webpages to improve color perception, for people who are partially color-blind.



Open Dyslexic

Open-Dyslexic is an open sourced font. The extension overrides all fonts on webpages with the OpenDyslexic font.



StayFocusd helps you stay focused on work by restricting the amount of time you can spend on time-wasting websites. Once your allotted time has been used up, the sites you have blocked will be inaccessible for the rest of the day.



Enforces a 25min/5min workflow: 25 minutes of distraction-free work, followed by 5 minutes of break. Repeat as necessary.

Strict Workflow



Cite web sites with one click using the EasyBib Toolbar and receive advice on the credibility of the website you're citing.

ATbar

ATbar is free and allows you to change the look and feel of webpages, have text read aloud and spell check forms. It is a simple tool which is available for most popular browsers.

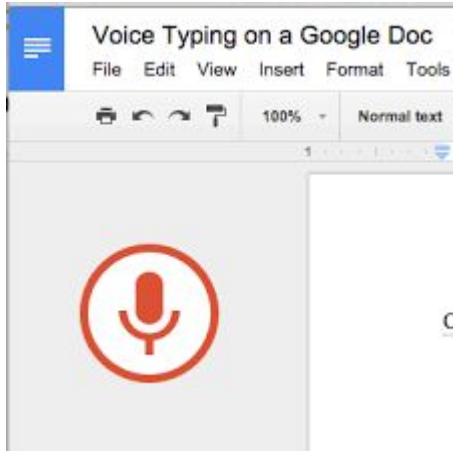
