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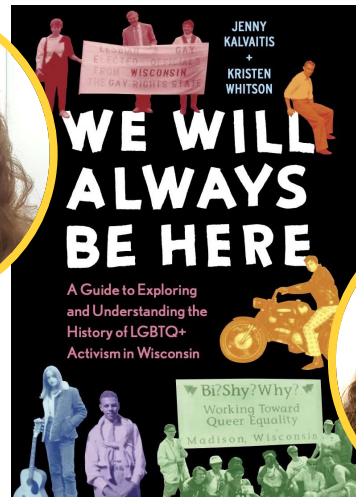

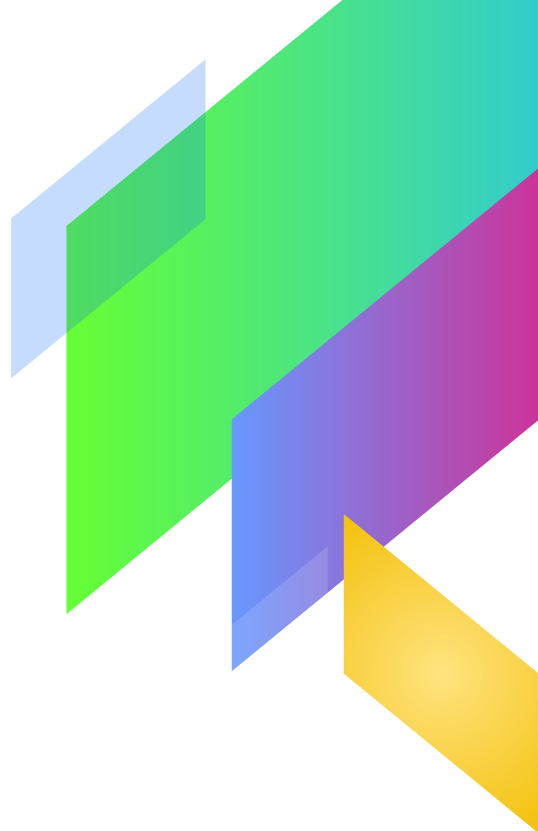

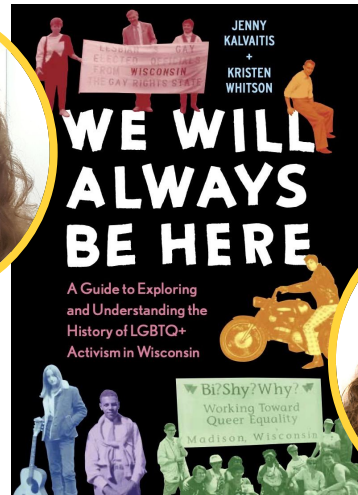

- › Added a minimum number of Board members (12).

- › Removed extraneous language about board terms, vacancies, and terms.
- › Updated dates around election.

Officers and Committees

- › Clarified language around Chair appointment.

Meetings

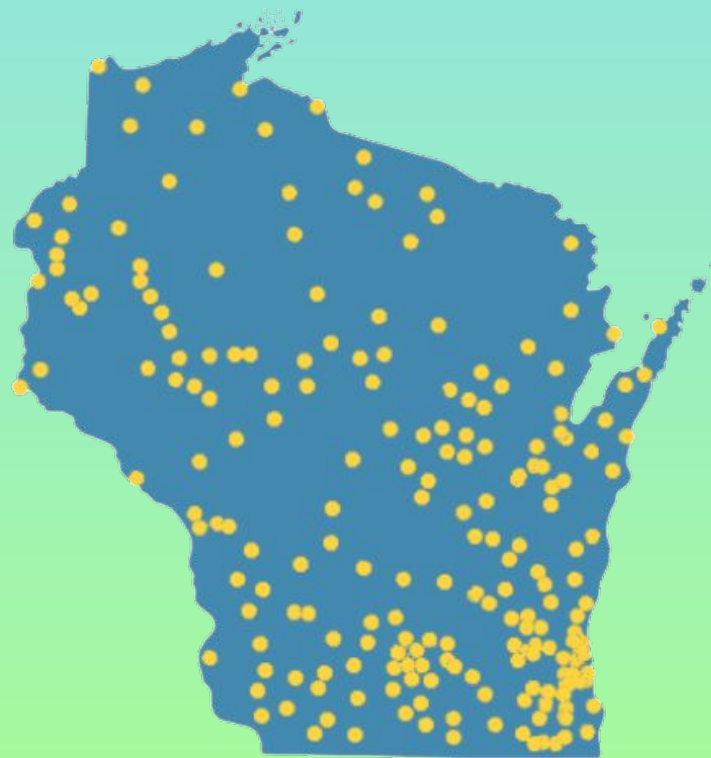
- › Added clarification for meeting agenda, what to do when the Board chair is absent, and meeting minutes.

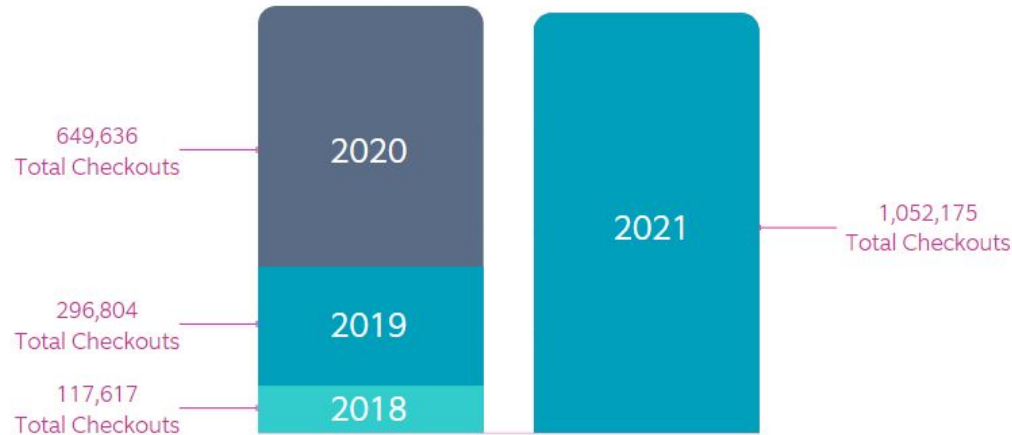

Use Continues to Rise

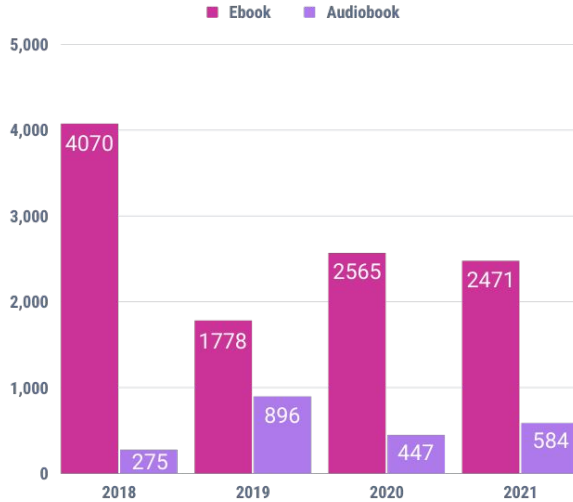
In 2021, there were more than 1,000,000 checkouts from the WSDLC collection, a 62% increase over 2020.

2018-2020 vs 2021

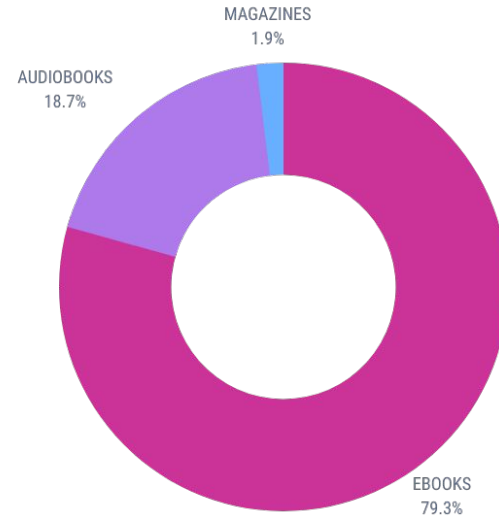


☆ Growing Collections

Number of new titles purchased year-over-year by format

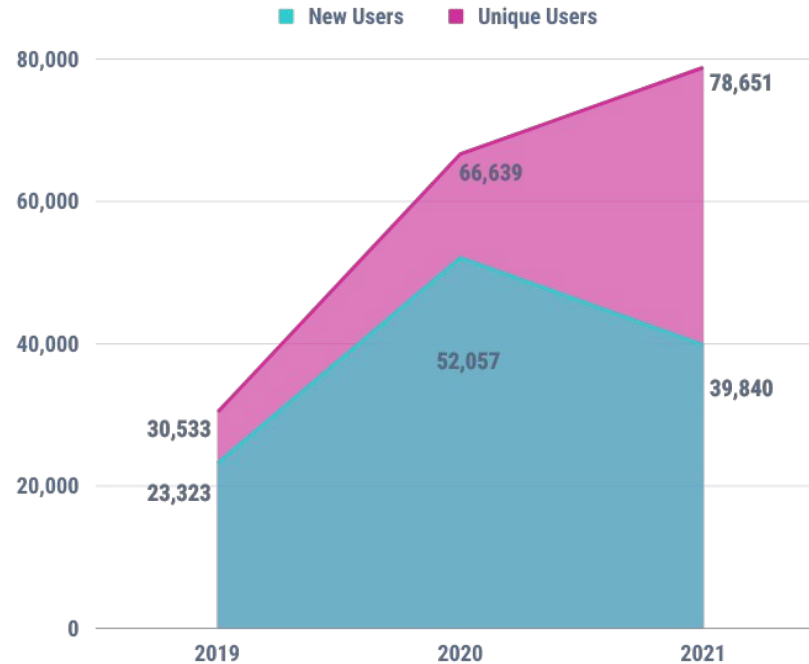


Percentage of all titles purchased in 2021 by format

26% of all enrolled students checked out a title in Sora in 2021

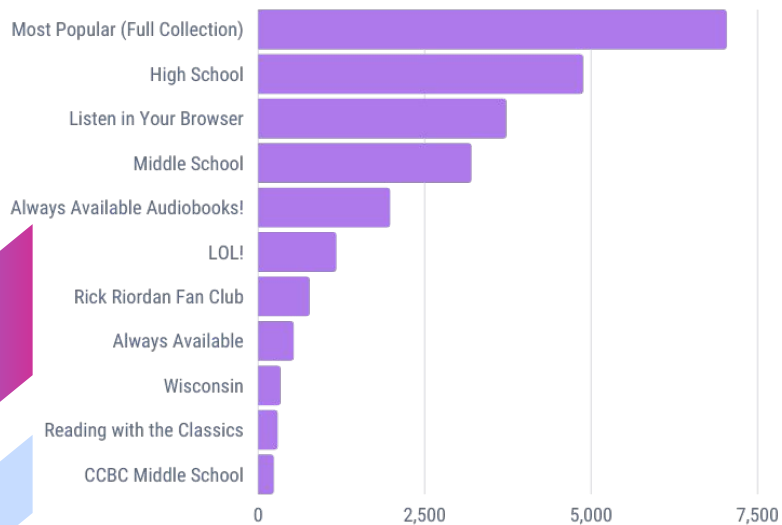
This is a 37% increase over 2020, and a 53% increase over 2019



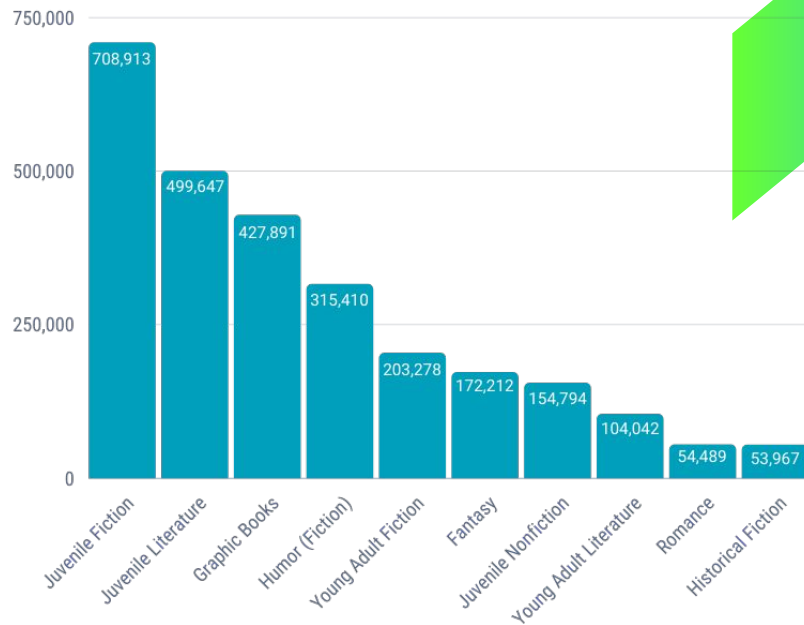


Most Popular of 2021

Overview

Member Satisfaction

All respondents indicated they are either Somewhat or Completely Satisfied with the collections.

Areas of Excellence

- > Variety and Number of titles
- > Ability to access anywhere
- > Supplements curriculum and physical library

Areas for Improvement

- > Reduce Holds on Popular Titles
- > Would like to hide Juv titles from upper grades
- > Standardization of "Audience" tags

Areas of Desired Growth

- > More Graphic Novels, Read-Alongs, and Classic Titles
- > More titles for 4K students
- > More Copies of Popular Titles
- > More Audiobooks in the K-5 and 6-8 Collections
- > Additional Content Access Level(s)
- > Complete Titles in a series

Training & Marketing

- > Most respondents are aware of training and marketing resources
- > Awareness is growing!
- > No respondents felt the training materials weren't helpful.
- > 92% of respondents actively market the WSDLC collections



2022 Survey Highlights

Challenges to Materials



Has your school or district faced challenges to materials in a WSDLC Collection?

- ✓ 13% of respondents said they have had challenges to titles in their school district.
- ✗ 84% of respondents have *not* faced any challenges to materials.
- ⚠ 4% of respondents aren't sure if their school district has received challenges.

13% of respondents said they have had challenges to titles in their school district.

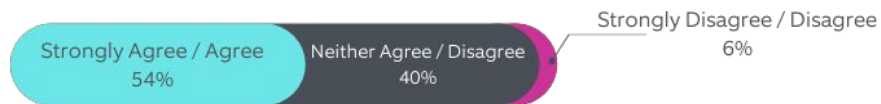

Adding Additional Content Access Levels

Respondents were asked if they agree/disagree with the following statement:
There Should Be Four Collections in Sora: K-2 Collection, 3-5 Collection, 6-8 Collection, and a 9-12 Collection.



Changing Collection Labels

Respondents ranked potential collection labels and divisions from most desirable to least desirable. The ranking results are:

- ① Early Elementary (K-2) | Upper Elementary (3-5) | Middle (6-8) | High (9-12)
- ② Elementary (K-5) | Middle (6-8) | High (9-12)
- ③ Early Elementary (K-2) | Elementary (3-5) | Middle (6-8) | High (9-12)
- ④ Juvenile (K-5) | Young Adult (6-8) | Adult (9-12)
