

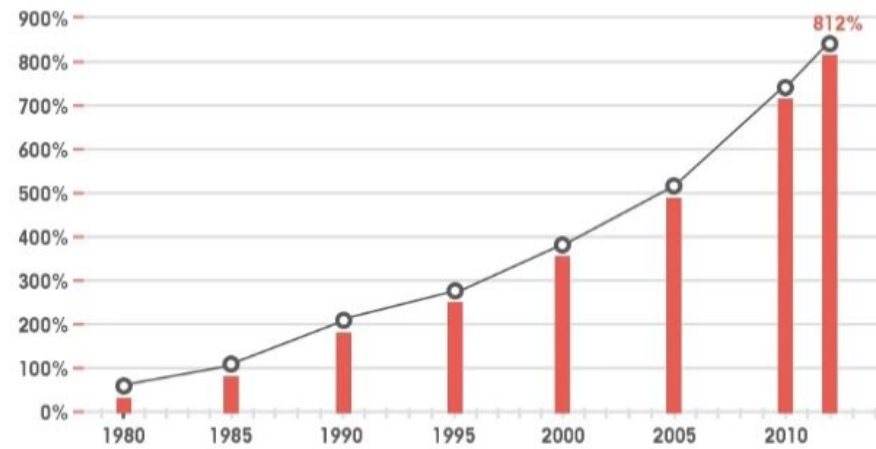

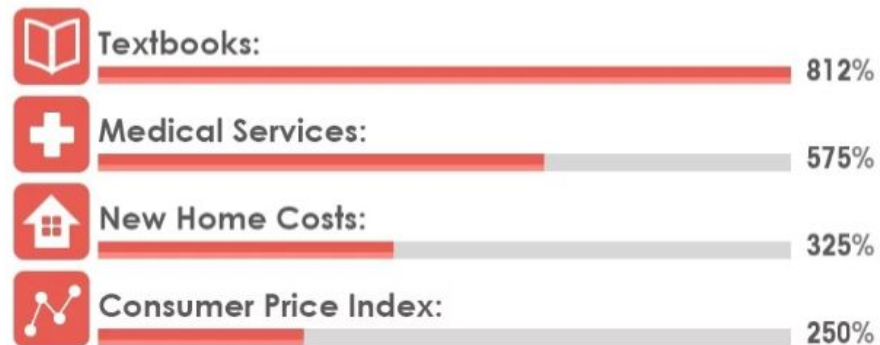


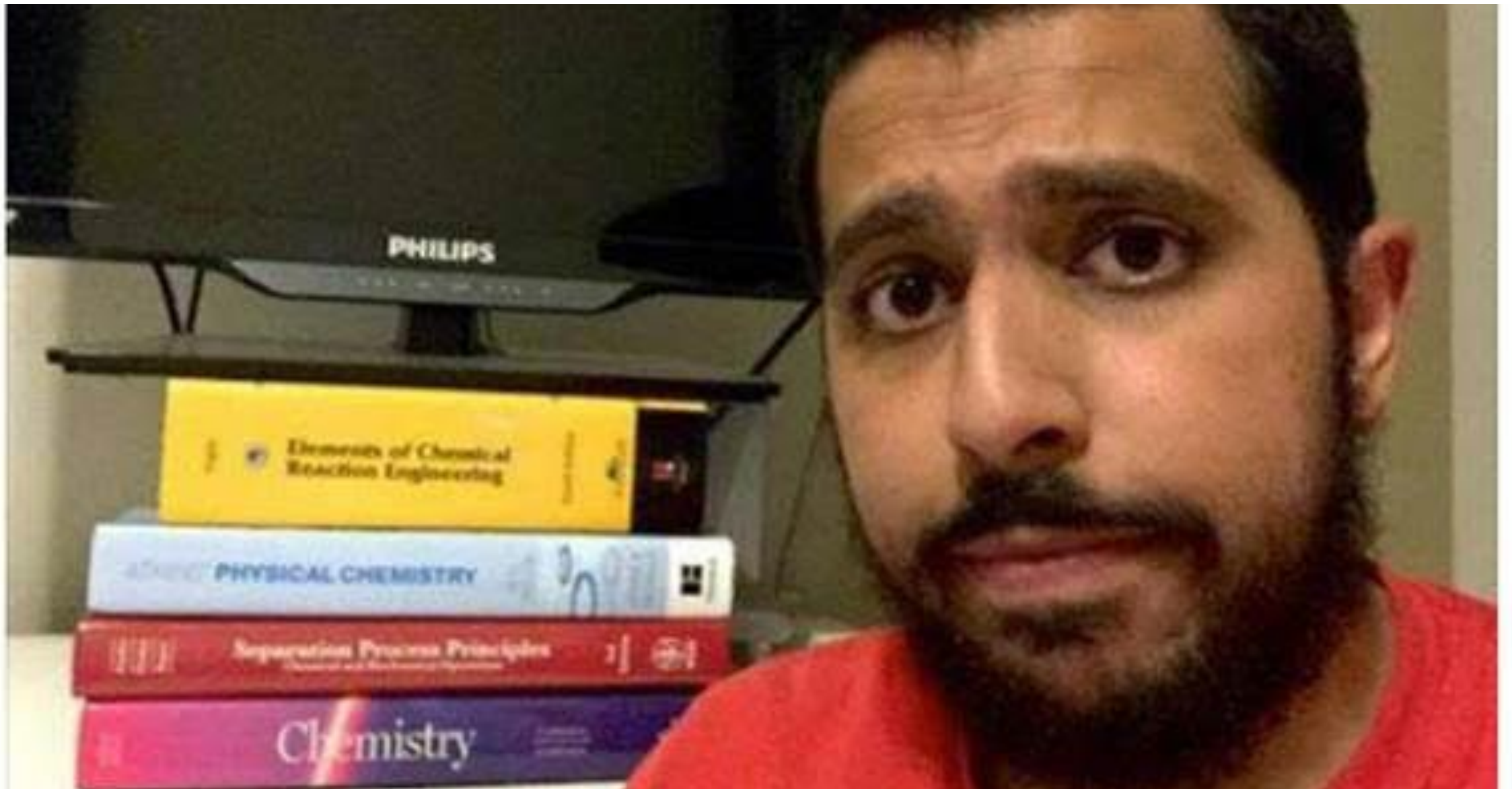
TEXTBOOK COSTS: 1978 - 2013

PERCENT CHANGE IN TEXTBOOK PRICES SINCE 1978

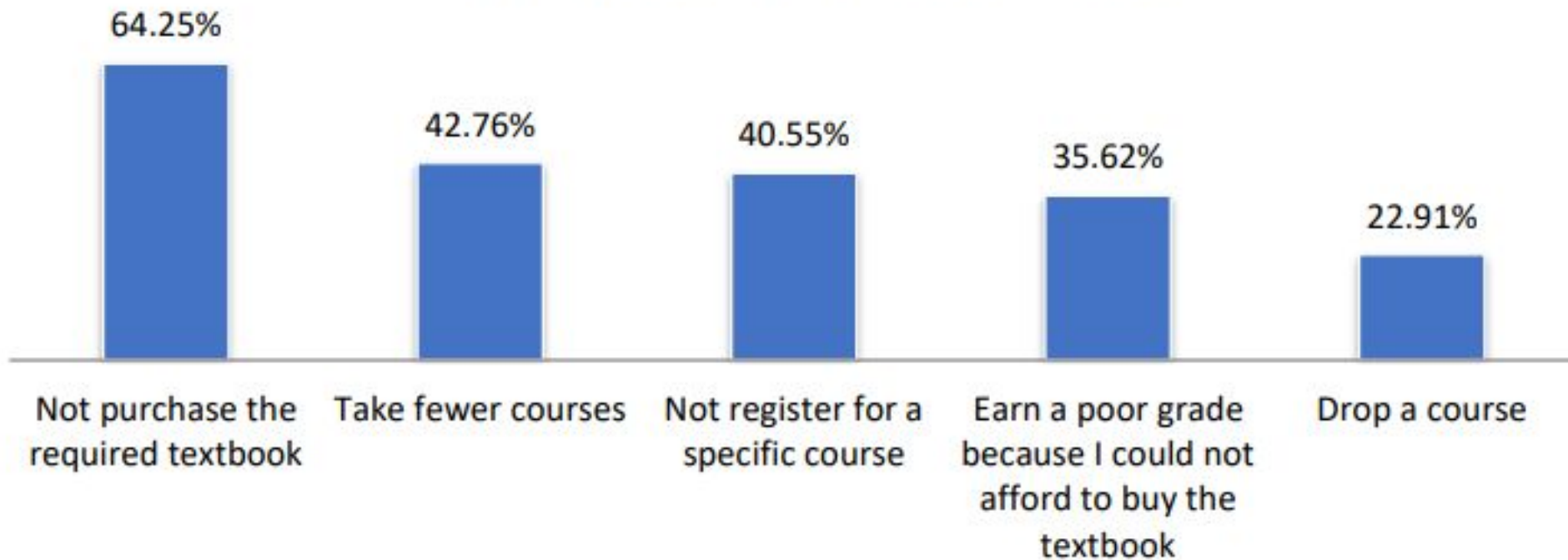


TEXTBOOK COSTS HAVE INCREASED FASTER THAN:

Oregon House Bills

2213

- ◆ “Each community college and public university shall establish a textbook affordability plan.”
- ◆ “At least one student representative must be included and consulted in the development of each textbook affordability plan established”

2871

- ◆ Low/ no cost text materials must be discoverable in course search
 - Oregon Tech does not meet this standard

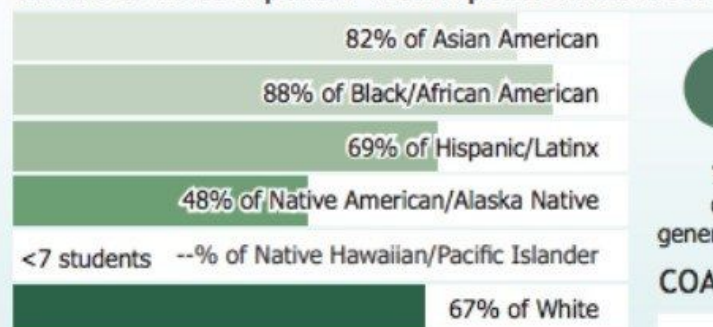

Unable to Meet Expenses with Expected Resources

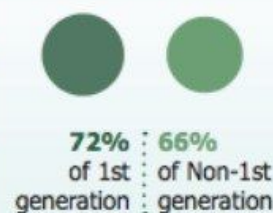

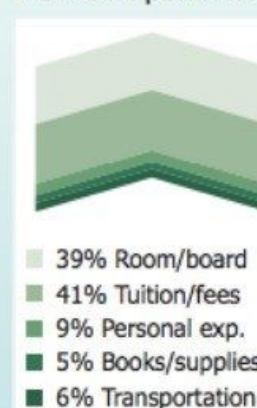

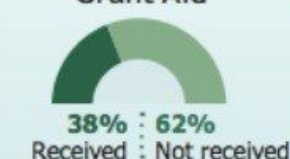
