





Oregon House Bills

2213

- "Each community college and public university shall establish a textbook affordability plan."
- * "At least one student representative must be included and consulted in the development of each textbook affordability plan established"

2871

- Low/ no cost text materials must be discoverable in course search
 - Oregon Tech does not meet this standard


