Born in Italy in 1870


A rigorous researcher, a philosopher, a medical doctor and anthropologist, among other things.

Developed an approach to education that is child centered, and based on scientific observation and principles of human development.



Attendance

Curriculum

The Montessori curriculum is a spiral curriculum that is based on the following principles:

- 1. Students learn concepts from the big picture to increasing detail.
- 2. Students learn concepts from the concrete to the abstract.
- 3. Lessons are interrelated. The Great Lessons lead students to more detailed lessons and research about the concepts within these Great Lessons.
- 4. Students return to major themes in the curriculum every 3 years to study them in greater depth.
