Purpose of the Interview Process

- Further confirm mutual fit between your goals, skills, and interests and those of the program and, in most cases, your potential advisor
- "...Students are evaluating and selecting programs as much as vice versa." —Mitch's Uncensored Advice for Applying to Graduate School in Clinical Psychology (2017)
- Remember: You're qualified!



Preparing for Interview Day

- Review program information (including emphasis), program handbook, faculty member interests and recent scholarship, and your statement of purpose and CV
- Draft potential questions for advisor, other faculty, and students
- For in-person interviews, plan travel, including the possibility of inclement weather and flight delays



Preparing for Online Interviews

- Secure internet connection
- Make sure your phone is on silent
- Find a quiet spot
- Still do your homework!
- Express gratitude



What to Expect During Interview Day

- Program overview
- The actual interview(s)
- Current and prospective student social



Good Questions for Faculty & Students

Faculty

- Clinical, research, funding opportunities
- Mentorship style

Students

- Lifestyle
- Partners/families
- Program culture
- Financial



Tips for Calming Nerves

- Try not to be too critical of yourself
 - INSTEAD remember to be invited for an interview means you are already an excellent applicant!
- Try not to think about whether the interviewers think you're a fit
 - INSTEAD focus on how the program fits for YOU
- Try not to compare yourself to other applicants
 - INSTEAD consider your strengths and the unique experience you would bring to the program
 - INSTEAD also consider making conversation with other applicants—you likely have a lot in common!



After the Interview

- Immediately following the interview day
 - Take some notes on positive and negatives of the program
 - Take care of yourself
- Following up with interview day
 - Thank-you emails
- Handling responses from programs
 - No thank-you's
 - Waitlist
 - Offers
