Body Paragraphs must include:

Topic Sentence

(Introduce what paragraph will be about/point of support)

+

Evidence #1

(introduced and explained)

+

Reasoning #1

(how your point of support & evidence supports/proves the claim)

+

Evidence #2

(introduced and explained)

+

Reasoning #2

(how your point of support & evidence supports/proves the claim)

Drafting a strong topic sentence

Example: Is lying ever justified

Topic sentence

Begin with a topic sentence that reflects the claim and introduces the evidence you will be discussing in the paragraph.

A bare bones topic sentence merely answers the question ("Is lying ever justified?"):

Lying is never justified. (2)

A topic sentence that includes the reason from your claim is a bit of an improvement:

Lying is never justified because it is harmful. (3)

Topic sentence

To take it to the next level, a topic sentence includes the reason in the claim, provides additional context and explanation, and uses more sophisticated language.

Lying hurts those being lied to as well as those who are lying; therefore, it can never be justified. (4)
