





#### Why E-Portfolios?

Encourages reflection.

Can assist in the curation of assessment for, as and of learning.

Gives a sense of identify to students.


Showcases developmental learning and achievements.

Can be interactive, and stored and accessed without physical limits.

# Benefits of E-portfolios (process)

- They will discover a valuable exercise in self assessment through the reflection process.
- Learning will take on a new depth through the reflection process.
- Their self esteem and self-confidence will be enhanced as they take control of their learning.
- Assessment of their learning may become more student centered; the learner is involved and authorized to make decisions about will be evaluated.
- They will receive more recognition for individual learning abilities and preferences.
- They will learn and begin to practice a process that will be used in life long and life wide learning pursuits.





# How e-portfolios were introduced with Year 5-6 students

Template provided - each student received a Google Site.

Existing aspects from students' Personal Learning Folders (paper based) were incorporated (digitised).

Students provided with 5 generic pages, and 1 announcement page to serve as a journal.

Students were trained in editing and managing their e-portfolios (Google Site)






Maths: I became better at fractions because I worked as hard as possible in classes and worked on it at home if I didn't really understand the work that we had to do.



Make a site template available on your GAFE domain.

<u>Use HAPARA to automatically generate student</u>

<u>e-portfolios.</u>

or

Make a site template available on your GAFE domain. Direct your students to the template and <u>make a copy of the site to their own account</u>.

or

Use chrome extension <u>Easy Portfolio Site Builder</u> to generate sites from a template.

## Steps to e-portfolios and GAFE

Consider your own and your students' prior experiences in using portfolios, web tools, social networks, for personal and professional reasons.

Determine your vision and purpose for implementing eportfolios in your school.

Determine the type of artifacts that will be collected, and how this will be done.

Create a PD plan for implementing this yourself or with your teachers.

Determine the challenges and what tools will be used.

Determine how the portfolios will be used for assessment, and how you will evaluate your progress.
