He trains hard in the gym and loves hand cycling long distances in the off season as well as watersports such as wake surfing, water skiing and kayaking. Brian also does a lot of trail riding on his ATV and snowmobile when he has the time during his winter breaks at home. Family and friendships are very important to him and he makes time to see the great people in his life as often as possible. During his down time he listens to a lot of music, read books and do puzzles for fun.
