Norms

Norms are shared expectations for a group

- → Your camera can be on or off
- → You can ask questions at any time
- → You can share or just listen; please **remain muted** if you are not speaking



Introductions

- Name
- → Your connection to District 26



If you feel comfortable sharing...

- → Your family's language background
- → Why you're interested in BPAC

Student Rights

- Free & appropriate public education regardless of immigration status
- → Appropriate language assistance services to become proficient in English (District ML programming & certified teachers)
- Access to **grade level** curriculum
- Equal opportunity to participate in all programs, including gifted and talented & AP classes

Parent Rights

- → Right to **opt out** of ML services (also right to re-enter)
- → School communication to limited English proficient parents in a language they can understand. Examples:

Registration & Enrollment	Parent Handbooks	Report Cards
Discipline Policies	Special Education Information	Parent-Teacher Conferences

Parent Rights (continued)

- → Language assistance to parents, even if their child is English proficient
- → Request for a special education evaluation

- → Schools cannot ask for proof of citizenship. They can ask for information that confirms:
 - ◆ You live within district boundaries
 - ◆ Your child's date of birth

Parent Involvement

Involvement Barrier	Possible Solution
I don't know enough about the school to get involved.	 Attend Open House or Curriculum Night (fall) Attend Parent-Teacher Conferences Watch YouTube presentations of BOE meetings Read all newsletters Meet with the principal Follow District social media
I don't know if my child is doing well in school.	 Attend Parent-Teacher Conferences Review work being sent home for <i>comments</i> Reach out to the teacher (email or phone)
I don't know how to get involved at school, and I don't know who to ask.	 Attend PTC meetings (monthly) Talk to the school secretary Ask your child's teacher Attend BPAC meetings and ask questions :)


