

## **Mental Health Liaison**



The Mental Health liaison supervises and supports the implementation of the district's comprehensive school mental health plan. Communicates and collaborates with other community service providers to ensure an effective and impactful service delivery. Provides skills training with psycho-education and mental health strategies to staff and colleagues. Assists supervisee's in developing specific mental health support plans for students with relatable and realistic social/emotional goals. Make professional recommendations to refer for enhanced services when proven necessary. Supervises and guides our student support specialists.

We currently have 4 Student Support Specialist positions in the district. They identifies, triages and co-manages students with social emotional/ mental health concerns within the school-based setting. Provides skills training through psycho-education and offers support throughout the MTSS process. Develops specific mental health protocols and strategies for identified populations. # McKinney-Vento

- Identification is for the entire school year, even if permanent housing is obtained.
- Doubled-up, shelters, hotel/motel, unsheltered, uninhabitable housing, refugees, migrants, and human trafficking victims
- Unaccompanied Homeless Youth: Students who meet McKinney-Vento definition with the lack of a parent/guardian. “Couch-Surfing”
- Services provided: Food, clothing, school supplies, rent/deposit/utility assistance, housing assistance, required school documents, tutoring (middle school), high school MV Support Specialist, etc.
- If you have concerns about a student being homeless please contact your School Social Worker.
