


You're the copyright holder of the photo = you can do whatever to the photo you take (copy, distribute, modify, etc.)



- Photo taken by Jenny
- Anne is the copyright holder.

If you want to use Jenny's photo for her assignment, you will need to **take** a permission from Jenny.



Creative Commons License is a Way to Give Permission for People to Reuse Your Work



You still own the copyright, but you allow others to reuse the work, provided the cite/attribute you as the "author" of the work

- Photo taken by Jenny
- Jenny is still the copyright holder.
- Jenny decided to license her work as Creative Commons License (CC BY)

As long as you **credit/attribute** Jenny's photo, you have a permission to use Jenny's photo


