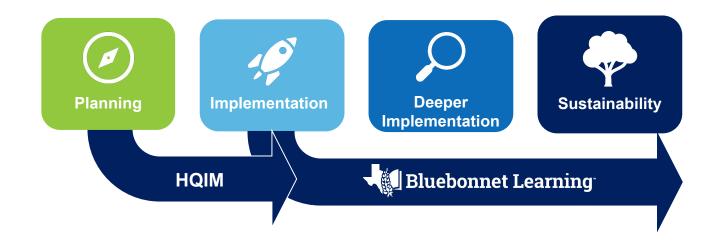

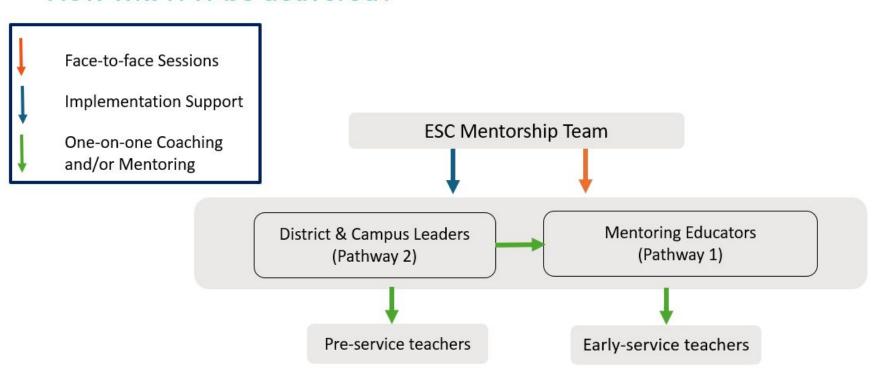

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES









SENATE BILL 13

According to TLA,SB I3 by Sen. Angela Paxton, was passed by the 89th Texas Legislature and signed into law by Governor Abbott.

Effective date:

SEPTEMBER 1, 2025

It is meant to be a law that works in conjunction with HB 900.

COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT

Prohibits library material with "profane content" or "indecent content from school library collections.

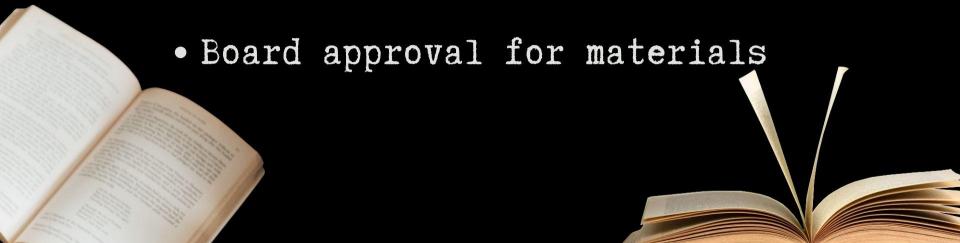
Prohibits library material that refers to a person or website content proheibeted by law by a link or QR code.

Broadly defines "library material" as any book, record, file or other instrument or document in a school districts library catalog. Instructional materials and materials in Textshare are not considered library material for the purpose o this law.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT SB 13

- Policy required before the start of the 2025-2026 school year.
- Parents rights have expanded



The school board must adopt a policy for acquiring library materials, including public review for 30 days purchasing and the receipt of donated materials.

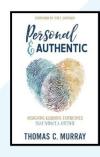

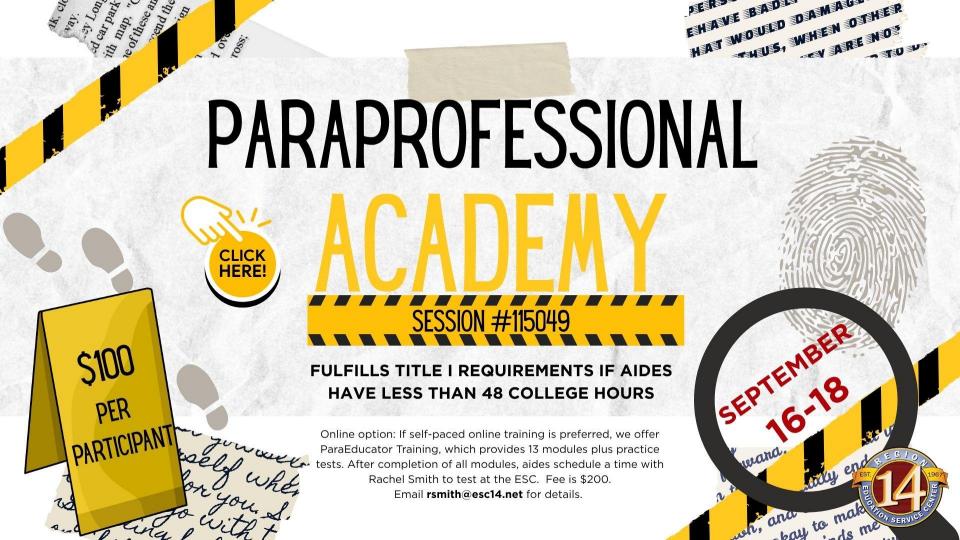

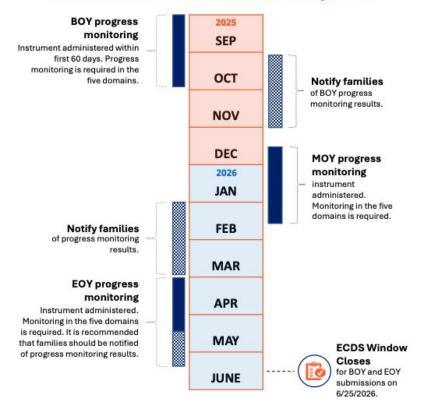

House Bill 2, Article 5

- New Requirements from House Bill 2, Article 5, Section 5.09, 89th Texas Legislature to be implemented in the 2025-2026 SY: Kindergarten BOY reading instruments are now required to be administered no later than the 60th day of the school year. Families must be notified of BOY results in writing or electronically no later than the earlier of the 20th school day or the 30th calendar day after results are available.
- Discontinuation of Early Reading Indicator (ERI) Data Element Collection: Effective immediately, the Early Reading Indicator Data Element will no longer be collected through PEIMS. This change is a result of the repeal of the statutory requirement that was the basis for the data collection.



2025–2026 Key Dates and Requirements for Prekindergarten through Grade 2 Instruments

This document outlines the Texas Education Agency's guidance for early childhood instrument administration and the related required reporting <u>due dates for ECDS and PEIMS data collections</u> for prekindergarten through grade 2 students for the 2025-2026 school year.
