

Reid Ferguson was signed by the Buffalo Bills as an undrafted free agent on May 2, 2016 and became part of the practice squad later that year. After a year of hard work, Reid became the starting long snapper for the Bills in 2017. Reid played in all 16 games that season and helped the Bills reach the NFL Playoffs. Reid again played all 16 games during the 2018 season and in January 2019, he signed a three-year contract extension with the Bills through the 2021 season.

Reid first started playing football in Buford, Georgia and was ranked the #2 long snapper in that nation during his senior year in high school. Reid continued playing at Louisiana State University, where he played all 51 games during four years and earned first-team All-American honors.

Reid has a dog named Buck- he's a golden doodle! Words of wisdom from Reid: "I'm still not perfect. You always have to work to be perfect. There's always something to improve on."









Tyler Matakevich is #44 on the Buffalo Bills team, a Temple University alumni from Philadelphia, PA and being a 7th round draft pick on the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2016.

Comping from Stratford, CT Tyler attended St. Joseph High School in Trumbull, CT and played both football and baseball during his time there!

During his senior year at Temple University, Tyler become the 7th player in FBS history to record 100 tackles all 4 years. Leading Temple to the inaugural AAC Champ During his final year of eligibility, Tyler received national honors including the AAC Defensive Player of the Year, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Chuck Bednarik Award. All three were firsts for Temple Football.
