Year 11: Curriculum Intent

The GCSE Fine Art course aims to promote learning across a variety of experiences and through various processes, techniques, materials and resources to generate evidence of a clear creative journey leading to informed and meaningful outcomes.

During Year 11 students will complete their Component 1 portfolio and Component 2 externally set assignment.
