# **General Structure of Your Proposal**

- Introduction
  - What are you researching and why is it important?
- Methodology
  - How are you going to gather your results?
- Literature Review
  - What have other scholars written about this topic?
- Preliminary Source List
  - What sources do you plan to use?

#### What Is a Research Question?

A <u>research question</u> is the question you will be answering in your research. It is not the same as a <u>topic</u>, which is simply the general area you will be studying.

TOPIC

Air pollution in Bishkek

#### **RESEARCH QUESTION**

How do Bishkek's strategies for air pollution management compare to those of other Central Asian capitals?

How does Bishkek's air pollution affect residents' decisions about where to live?

How does Bishkek's air pollution affect residents' voting patterns in city elections?

#### What Makes a Good Research Question?

A research question should be <u>specific</u>, <u>answerable with credible sources</u>, <u>feasible to</u> <u>tackle given your time constraints</u>, <u>neutral</u>, and <u>complex</u>.

EXAMPLES OF BAD RESEARCH QUESTIONS

How does air pollution affect people?

How does Bishkek's air pollution impact people's health over a ten-year period?

Why are politicians too lazy to find a solution to Bishkek's air pollution problem? Is pollution bad?

Does Bishkek have an air pollution problem?

### Introduction

- What is the *focus of your research*?
- Why is it *important*?
- What is/are your <u>research</u> <u>question(s)</u>?

- This study will examine...
- The goal/objective of this project is to...
- This project seeks/aims to...
- I hope to shed light on...
- This is significant because...

# Methodology

- What is your <u>research design</u>? How will you <u>collect</u> your data? How will you <u>analyze</u> it?
- What is your *justification* for your choices? Why didn't you choose another method?
- Are there any <u>shortcomings</u> to your methodological approach? Are there any <u>flaws</u> in your research design that you should acknowledge?

- This study will use/utilize...
- The survey will ask participants about...
- The goal of the interviews is to...
- To recruit participants, I will...
- [Method] will be used in order to...
- ... might be over/underrepresented in the sample.
- One limitation of this method is...

### Literature review

- What is <u>already known</u> about your research question?
- What <u>theoretical lenses</u> have already been applied or are relevant to this question?
- What <u>data</u> have other studies found that might be relevant?
- Is there a <u>hole in the scholarship</u> that you can help fill?
- Do you *find fault* with the work of previous authors?

- Other scholars have argued...
- Previous research has found...
- Several/many studies have examined...
- However, these studies fail to...
- One area that has not been studied is...
- Relatively little is known about...
- ... is understudied/poorly understood.
- Building upon this earlier scholarship, I wish to...

### Conclusion

- What are the <u>real-world implications</u> of your findings?
- What is the *value* of this research?

- This study has implications for...
- The findings of this study can be applied to...
- This research will help us understand...
