A portal helps to teleport something from one to another place...




# The thinking behind this...


## l asked Al...

A component-based framework is a way of building software applications by putting together pre-built, reusable blocks of code called components. These components are like Lego bricks for software development – they each have a specific function and can be snapped together to create more complex applications.

#### No, not a component library






The button will trigger the modal...

Sometimes the best place for data is not the best place for rending




# So the way to solve this...


(Other than using z-index: 999999)




- Built in component in Vue
- Only updates the rendered DOM
- Does not affect the logical hierarchy of the components
- Has two props to, disabled
- to: CSS Selector
- disabled: to disable in special cases









### Some benefits of teleport...

- Flexible Component Placement
- Separation of Concerns
- Enhanced Accessibility
- Optimized Performance


