



Born in Springfield, Ohio, 1918, she moved to New York. There she learned, and practiced sculpture. In 1921 Abbott moved to Paris then Berlin to continue her study. She had worked with artists like James Joyce and Julien Levy and got into the idea of photography. In 1929 she arrived back to New York with a changed landscape. This was the start of her most famous work, documenting the Changing New York.


