Searching for Books or Other Materials Using MNCAT

A good place to start your research is with our online catalog of holdings and resources, MNCAT. You can search by keywork, person or by specific titles of books or magazines.

· Searching by Keyword

By using the 'keyword search for' box in MNCAT, you can search the catalog by key phrases to help you locate specific information that you need. For example: "Brown v Board of Education", Greensboro and sit-in*, "Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee", "Martin Luther King", "March on Washington", "United Farm Workers of America", Indians and Alcatraz and occupation; "National Organization for Women", "qay rights", "Americans with Disabilities Act", etc.


