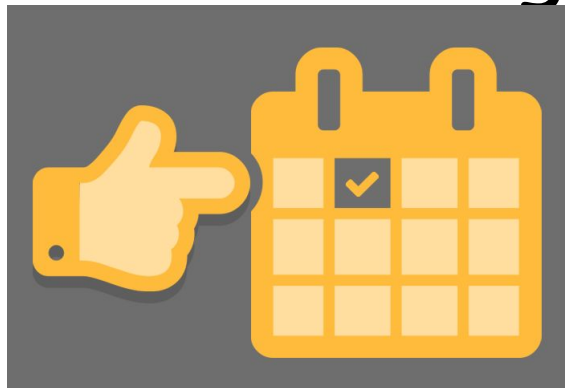

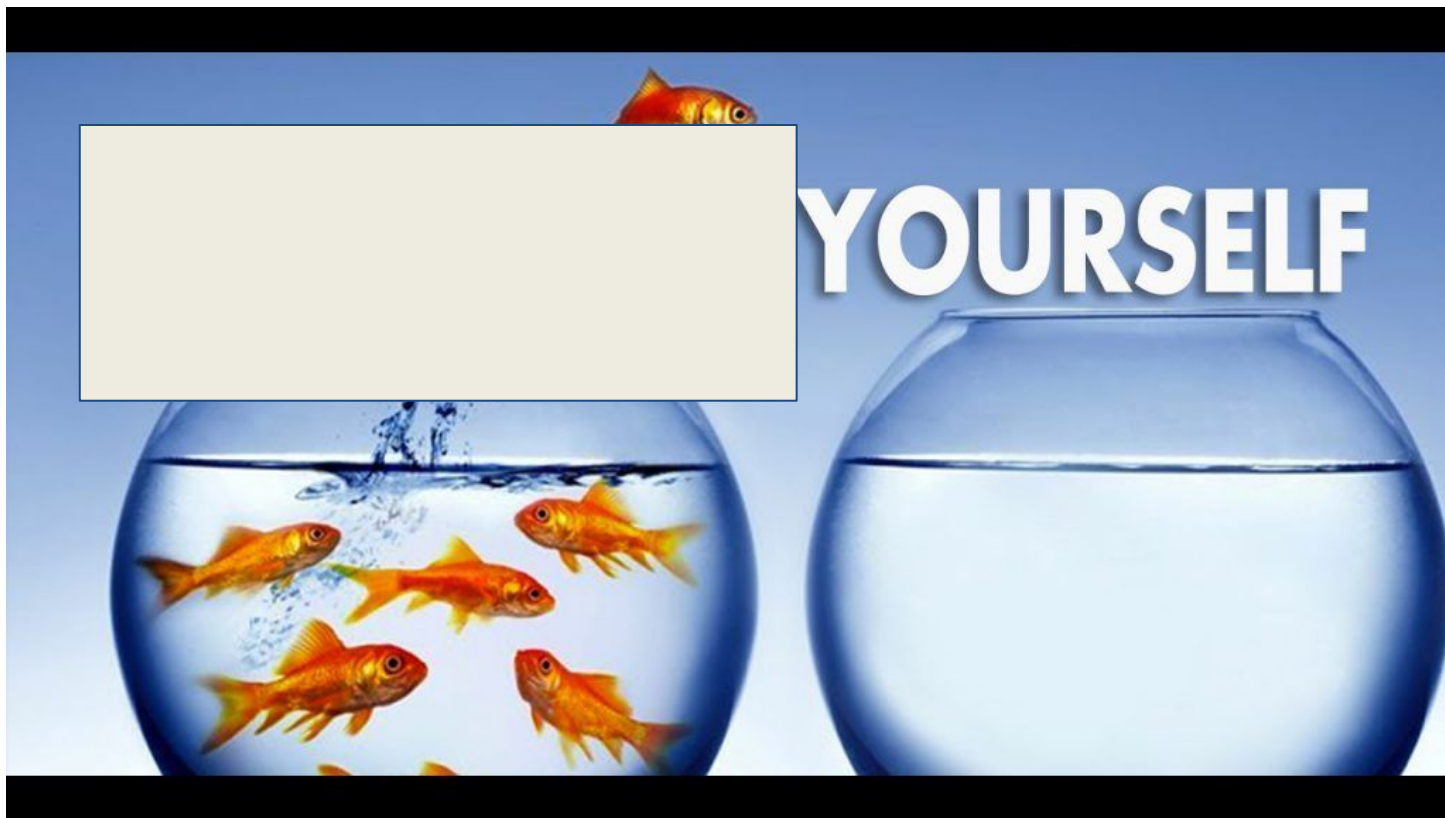

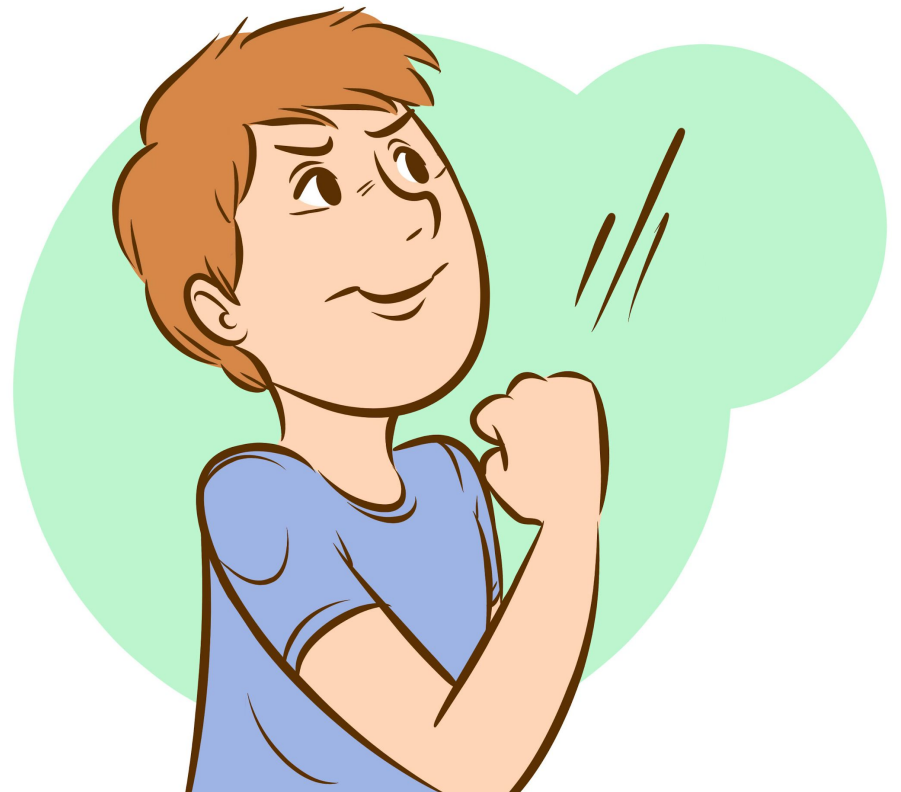
challenge

something that is difficult and that tests someone's ability or determination



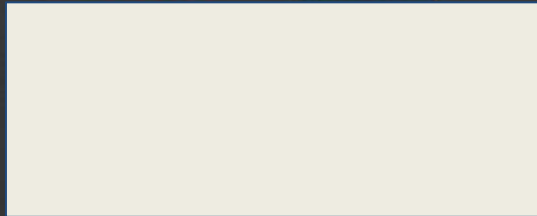
confident

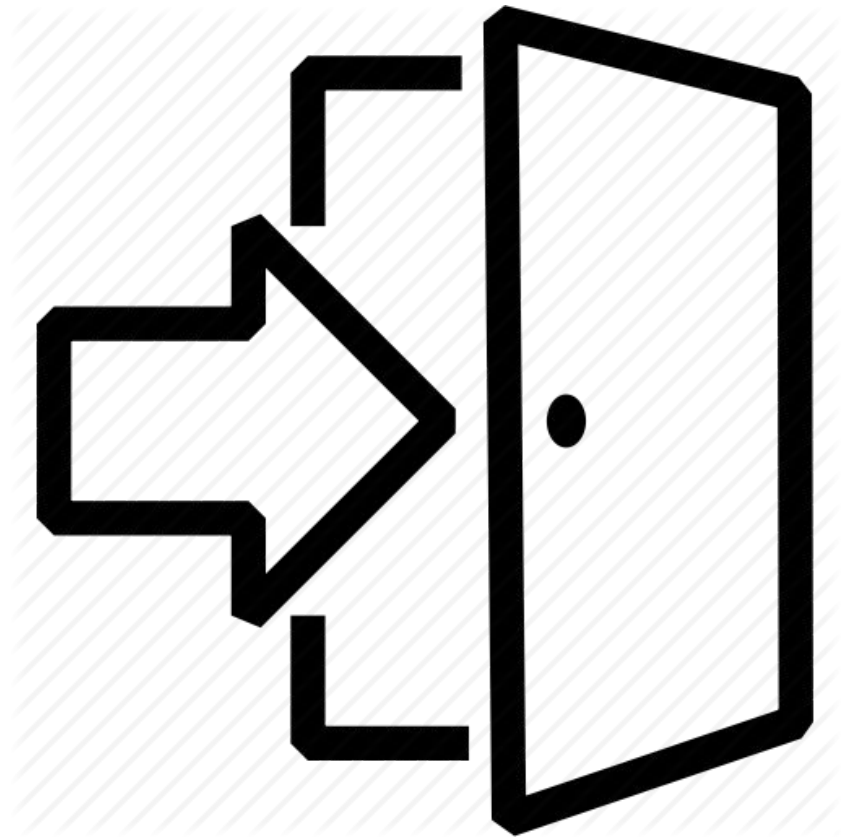
electrifying

and happy



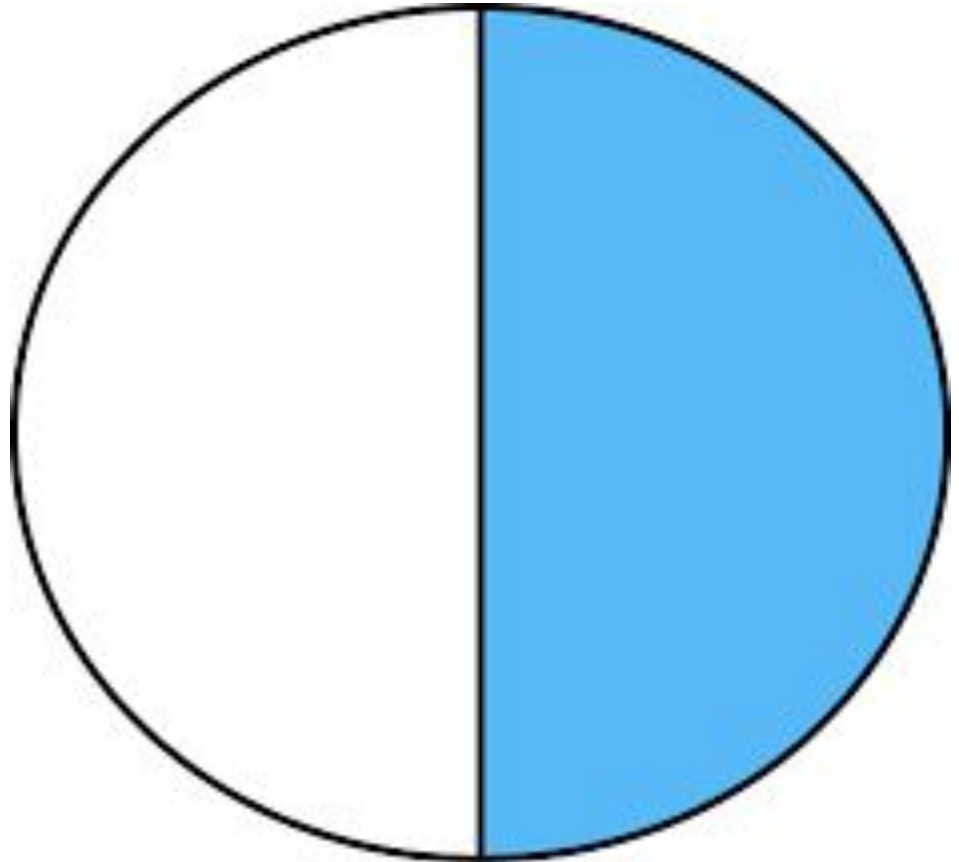
price

one of two equal parts of something; $1/2$:



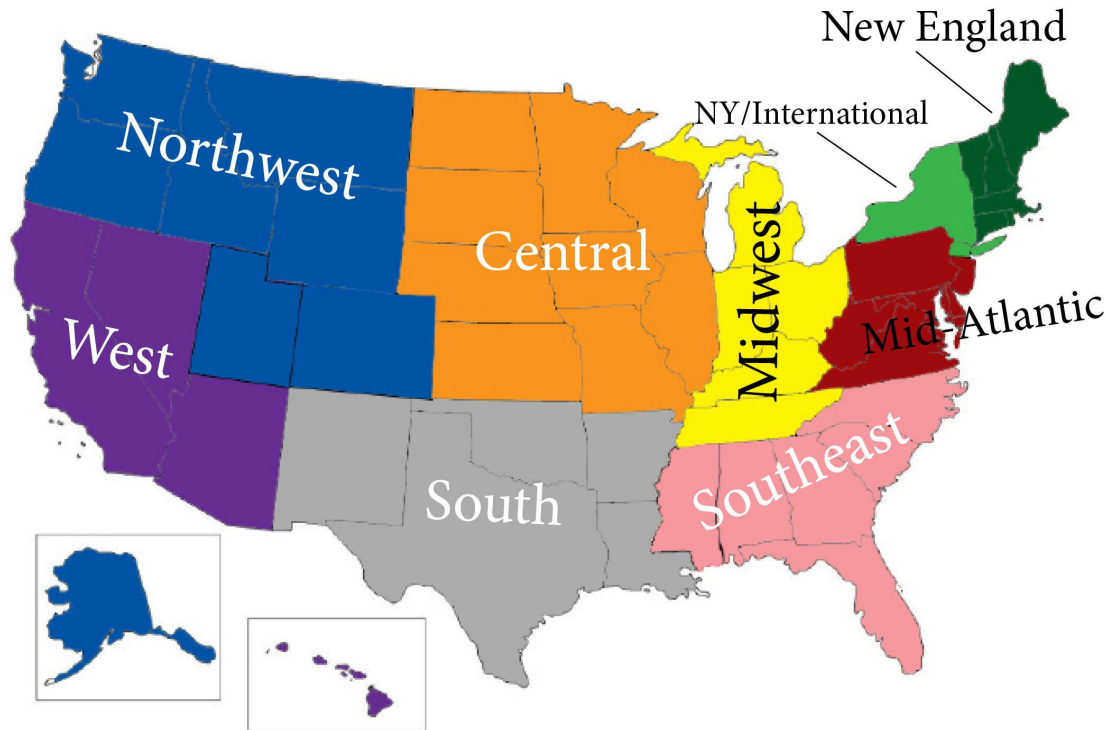
half price

costing half the usual price



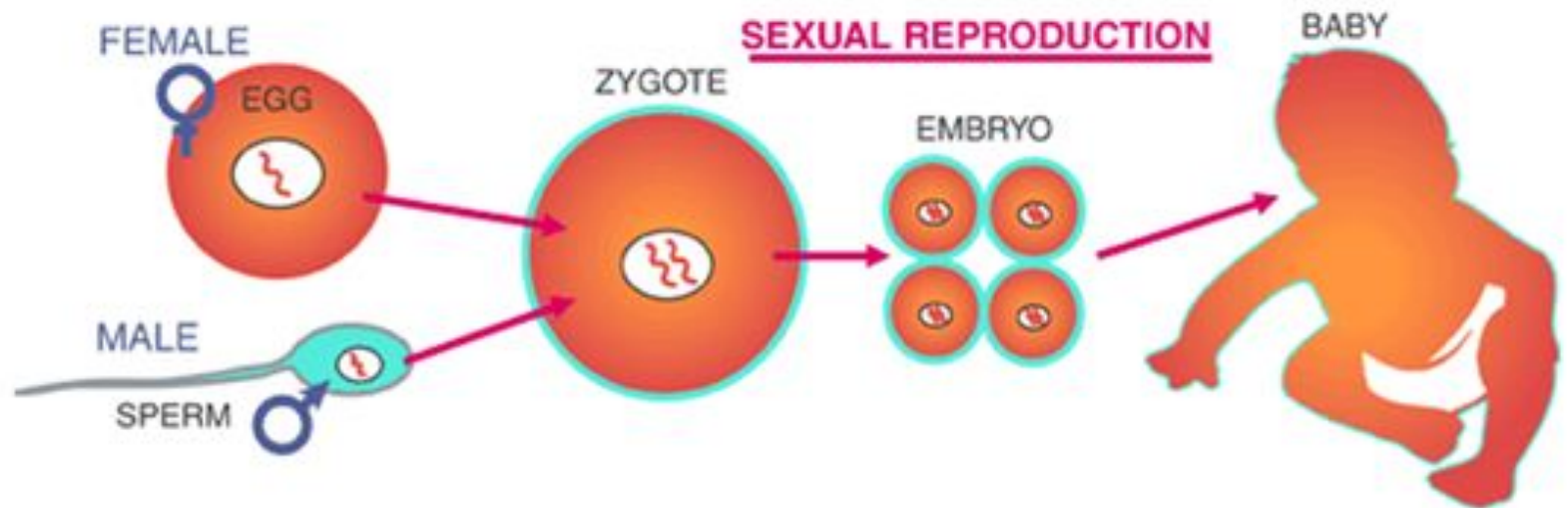
region

bob

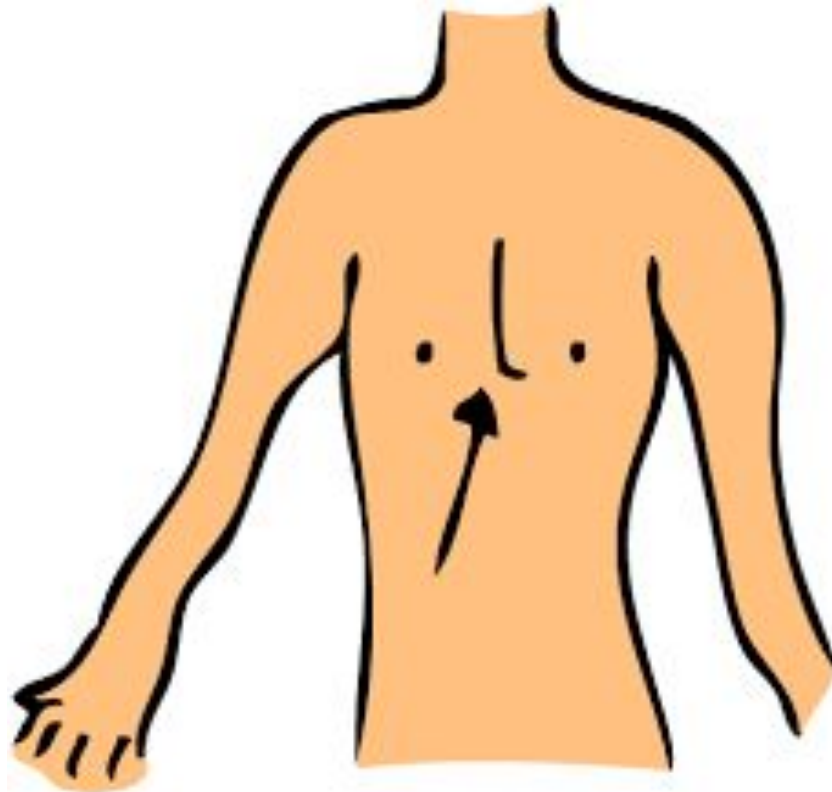
to move up and down quickly and gently
