

Manage Multiple Google Accounts

The Chrome web browser allows you to create multiple profiles, with each one connected to a different Google account. It is like having several copies of Chrome on your computer. Each profile is completely independent of the other profiles and their accounts, so nothing will ever get mixed between them.

1. **Choose the people menu item**
2. **Add Person - this will open a new chrome browser**
3. **Choose Sign in**
4. **Choose Link Data - this will allow bookmarks etc to sync across multiple devices**

Tip
click on 'person 1' to rename your profile so you can differentiate them

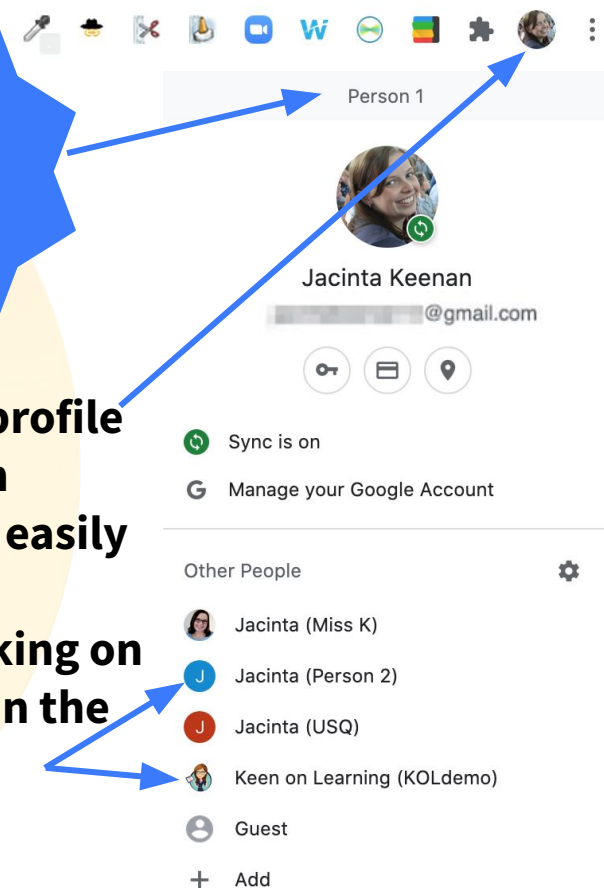
Once a Chrome profile is set up for each account you can easily switch between accounts by clicking on the people icon in the extension bar

Danger! Using One Profile For Multiple Accounts

Users can add multiple accounts to one Chrome profile. In Chrome click your profile icon, and choose “Add account” to link a second account (or more) to the same Chrome profile. This method makes the first account the default account.

Using this method can cause problems when trying to access emails or files that are linked to a particular Google account.

Instead users should choose the profile icon in the extension bar to switch between Chrome profiles - using a separate profile for each account.
