The SBCC Foundation launched the SBCC Promise in fall 2016.

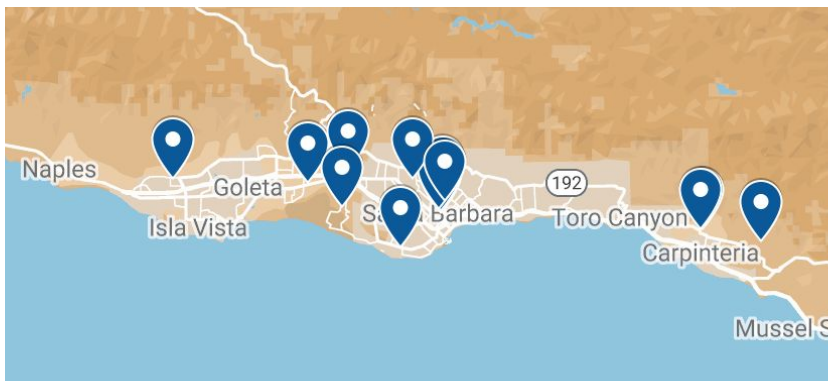
The SBCC Promise supports students who have recently completed high school (or equivalent programs) within the Santa Barbara Community College District. The SBCC Promise covers the cost of all required registration fees (tuition), student fees, textbooks, and course materials for two academic years.



Eligibility

Eligibility to sign up for the SBCC Promise:

- Complete high school (or equivalent programs) within the Santa Barbara Community College District.
- Enroll at SBCC immediately after high school completion (Fall or Spring).

Requirements

Students maintain their eligibility by attending SBCC continuously and completing all requirements during their two years in the SBCC Promise:

1. Apply for financial aid every academic year (FAFSA or CADAA).
2. Enroll full-time every term (12 units or approved DSPS reduced unit load).
3. Meet with an academic counselor every semester.
4. Maintain good academic standing at Santa Barbara City College.

Academic Counseling

- SBCC Academic Counseling Services offered on your campuses since Fall 2015
- Provide Academic Counseling at Monthly Visits organized through Enrollment Services
 - Assist students with identifying Certificate, AA and Transfer Requirements
 - SBCC GE/ IGETC/CSUGE Evaluations using AP Scores and Dual Enrollment coursework
- Provide Class Planning for Graduating Seniors
 - At the LHS Campus and online via zoom through Starfish
 - Create a first semester Student Educational Plan based on student's identified major and goal
 - Conduct early Class Planning Sessions in April for Students considering Disability Services
 - Conduct Class Planning in the fall for mid year graduates from SBHS, SMHS, DPHS, La Cuesta and Alta Vista

Academic Counseling

Counseling Services Available once students start SBCC:

- Ability to Schedule Counseling Appointments online in Pipeline via Starfish or In-Person by visiting the Counseling Department
- Counseling Appointments tailored to each student's modality needs (In-Person, Zoom, Google Meets, Phone)
- Drop in for Counseling Quick Questions
- Assistance for students with planning and achieving their Academic and Career goals (Teach students how to earn an AA/AS or certificate; how to transfer, how to research transfer schools, how to choose the correct classes to achieve their goals)
- Individualized Student Educational Plan (SEP)
- Counseling on Success Strategies and provide Early Intervention
- Support students in understanding and navigating complex policies and procedures
- Personal Development and College Success Courses taught by Academic and Career Counselors
