School Hours And Safety

- School hours are from 9:30am-4:10pm
- Car Riders should arrive no earlier than
 9:15 am
- Dismissal begins at 4:10pm
- Early Departure from school ends at 3:15 pm

Safety Protocols

Students are asked to stay seated with all of their belongings on the bus.

- -Parents are asked to respect the boundaries when they are dropping students off and busses are loading and unloading.
- -Parents are asked to pick up and drop students off at the curbside of the school.
- Parents are asked to report to the front office when they enter the building.
- Parents are asked to provide a current ID to be entered into the Raptor ID system.
- Parents are required to make an appointment to speak with administrators, teachers and school counselors.

Safety Protocols-Fire and Lock Down Drills

The expectation for monthly Fire Drills is for students to walk quickly and quietly to the designation.

During our lock down drills the students are expected to cooperate and be quiet.

Attendance

- Administrative Procedure 5113 governs attendance
- Students are expected to be present in class and participating on a daily basis.
- In the event of an absence, parents MUST document the reason for the absence within 3 days. This can be in the form of a written note or email, but the email should come from the parent's account.
- The reason should be a lawful reason (AP 5113) in order to be an excused absence

Attendance Cont'd

- Examples of Lawful absences: student illness, death in the family,
 mental health day, court summons, religious holiday, suspension, etc.
- For excused absences, students will have the same number of days as
 of the absence to make up work for full credit.

 For unexcused absences, teachers are **not** required to provide make up work.

Uniform Cont'd

School Uniform Non-Compliance

First violation - The teacher contacts the parent/guardian.

Second violation - The teacher refers the student to the administration who contacts the parent/guardian by telephone and in writing that a second violation has occurred.

Repeated violations will be deemed as persistent disobedience or insubordination and will be dealt with in accordance with the Students Right and Responsibilities Code

Grades

- Administrative Procedure 5121.2 governs grading
- Students are expected to be make a good faith effort on all assignments presented by the teacher
- Teachers will collect a minimum of 2 grades per week in any class that meets more than once that week
- If a class only meets once in a given week (holidays, etc.), only one grade will be assigned and collected that week.
