Turn on Restrictions

1. Tap Settings > General > Restrictions.




- 2. Scroll down and tap Restrictions, then tap Enable Restrictions.
- 3. Create a Restrictions passcode. You need your Restrictions passcode to change your settings or to turn off Restrictions.










First, drag down from the top of the screen, then drag down further if a settings cog icon doesn't appear. Tap on the icon to open the Settings app.






Scroll down until you see Users. If your phone has a Settings <u>app</u> split into sections, you might have to search other tabs to find the Users menu.

In Users, you'll see your own account, or the main account of the <u>owner</u> ot grade of the phone. There will be an 'Add user' option, so tap on this.

Accept the message by tapping 'OK' then tap on 'SET UP NOW'

The device will log you out and ask you to sign into the new user's account. As that's for a child in this case, you'll continue to make the settings.






Tap Continue, as in the image above left, then you'll be asked if you want to sign into an Android <u>account</u>. If you want to prevent your kids from downloading apps, games, music, videos and TV shows through Google Play, just tap on Skip Setup. You will still be able to download apps etc. via your own user account.


You'll also have the option to set up their email account, or tap Not now if you don't want to.

How can I restrict content in Play Store?

Assuming you do want to give your child access to the Google Play Store within their account, either sign in with your own Google account when prompted during the setup, or use their account if they have one.












Then, launch the Play Store app (this is in their user account on the phone or <u>tablet</u> ♂ still) and tap the 'hamburger' - the three horizontal lines at the top left.

Scroll down and tap Settings, then scroll until you see Parental ♂ controls.

Tap it, and you'll have to create a PIN code. Enter this twice.












If you want to prevent kids from buying content freely, you can set a PIN that only you know which will be asked for when they try to download anything that costs money. To do this, go back to the main Play Store settings menu and tap on 'Require authentication for purchases'. Then you'll see a screen like the one below, right.









The Play Store isn't the only place to download apps and games, so it's important to make sure other sources are blocked. To do this, go back to the device's home screen, and drag down from the top of the screen again to get to the cog icon - tap it to open the Settings app.










Find the Security section (called Security & fingerprint on our phone), tap it and then check to make sure the Unknown sources switch is turned off (which it probably will be).

Login to the family safety account using the same user password as is on your computer. Click "view activity report" on the user you want to set up parental controls




6 Click on "Web Filtering," and select "Turn on web filtering" to filter what the user can access on the Internet. Select the "designed for children" option and click "save."
















Choose the user account which you want to apply Parental Controls to. You can not apply Parental Controls to administrator users.

 If you can't make changes, make sure the lock icon at the left-bottom corner of the screen is Open. If not, click on it and enter your computer password to allow changes.










5 From the tabs located at the top of the window, you can edit permission and settings for the user. You can even monitor the user's iChat and Mail and filter Web Content. The best function is limiting usage time by giving it a schedule. For example, if you set 17:00-21:00 as the time that allows the user to login, the user will be automatically logged out at 21:00. This function is good to limit your children's playtime so they don't skip their homework
















2 Enter your router's username and password. Every router will require a username and password before you can access the innards. If you never changed this when you first configured the router, chances are the username is "admin" and the password is "admin" or "password". Of course this varies from model to model, so you should search your model online to see your exact login info.^[2]











Check out your security type. There are three main types of wireless encryption: WEP, WPA, and WPA2. For the most secure network, you should be using WPA2. You may run into issues connecting older devices, however, in which case you could switch to WPA or WPA/WPA2. Selecting WEP is NOT recommended, as WEP encryption is very easy to break (it can take less than 30 minutes to crack a WEP password).



6 Change your network name. While you're here, take a moment to change your network name if you have not already. The name should not include any personally identifiable information, as the name will be publicly broadcast. Changing the name will help deter people from trying to break into it. Routers with default names are seen as easier hacking targets.
