  - Students fill out / turn in <u>Scheduling Forms</u>
  - Teachers talk with students about course recommendations for '24-'25.
- July 15th
  - Any AP Course drop must be requested by July 15th.
  - Requests will be honored based on seat availability in other courses.



# **Program of Studies**

- The Program of Studies has Graduation Requirements, short description of each course, and any pre-requisite or grade level requirements.

- AP Courses are available for students in grades 9-12
- 8th Grade students will have the opportunity to take some high school credits, but must earn a "B" or better to earn high school credit. If a "B" or better is not earned, the course will have to be retaken to earn high school credit.



# **College and Career Readiness Courses**

- Reading/Math Lab courses occur at all grade levels.
- Students not reaching Benchmarks on various assessments will be assigned to these classes.
- The courses are designed to help students meet Benchmark earlier in their high school career and get students the academic support that they need.

## **ACT Test:**

# **Incoming 7th Grade Parents**

## **School Overview**

- The high school includes grades 7 12, but GPA and most credits do not start to be earned until 9th grade.
- 7th grade students are a Grade Level Team. 7th grade core subject teachers collaborate and monitor 7th graders. The team also sends out assignments each week to parents.
- We will have a 7th Grade Orientation Night (parents and students) in August to cover daily procedures, lockers, and student schedules.
