

# Why? 🤨

Naming the factors that influence our work, whether we are in control of them or not, gives us the ability to narrow in on problems, account for them and ideally solve them:

#### Ideal outcomes of this exercise are:

- 1. Intentionality- being able to see things without the lens of chaos
- 2. Deliberative action think before we react or act, at all
- 3. Strategic accounting looking at things from a strategic lens and predicting what might happen next

When we can name and tame the elements that influence our work, both good and challenging, we can predict them and account for them

#### How it works **?**:

We are going to take 6 minutes (respectively) to answer 2 questions about the factors that influence our work:

- 1. What are the factors that influence my work (or my team's work) that we can control?
- 2. What are the factors that influence my work (or my team's work) that I cannot control?

For the sake of clarity- let's define control as: the power to influence or direct people's behavior or the course of events
